# Charitable Objectives

The charity's objectives are:

- 1) To relieve the mental and physical distress of drug and alcohol dependents by providing accommodation with links to treatment provision in a supportive environment.
- 2) To assist in the relief of emotional distress of relatives, carers and friends of drug and alcohol dependents by providing family support groups and links to other providers of of care services.

The Trustees consider that these objectives, and the activities summarised below, further the company's charitable purposes for the public benefit. In planning our activities for the period, we kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit at our Trustees' meetings.

## Review of Activities

I am pleased to report on another year as chair of St Anthony's Project for Homeless Addicts. Like all charities it has been a challenging time due to the Covid19 pandemic and lockdowns. This has caused restrictions in working with other agencies as our clients have not been able to access some recovery groups in person only by zoom meetings. As mainly our service users live in at the project and normally have a built-in program involving participating in recovery groups with those agencies this has caused a big change to our daily structure with participating on site for long periods of time during the day in the lock down. This does of course have its impact on mental health, while already dealing with drug/alcohol dependency issues.

I am pleased to say however that despite this we have adapted to the changes and are now running our service mainly on site. Obviously as all good charities our primary concern is for the welfare of those who seek our help, so we are therefore, forever looking outwards for new ways to improve the service we offer at the project.

I am extremely proud to say despite challenges we have still had successful outcomes with our clients this year remaining abstinent from drugs and continuing to re-build their lives with hope for the future. This is said with total admiration for our men as despite the pandemic some have been incredibly determined to succeed and remain abstinent also rebuilding family relationships.

This has been due to our very experienced manager and staff who have adapted to the changes and risen to the challenges brought on by the pandemic. We are extremely fortunate to have them all and are incredibly grateful to have such a dedicated team during these challenging times.

It goes without saying that all the changes have incurred extra costs for staffing and fuel etc. So, we are extremely grateful to our funders this year who have provided extra emergency funding for running costs and enabled a garden project and music project to take place where our clients have been able to write and perform their own song led by a very experienced singer song writer this has been a massive help during the lock down period and brought lots of laughter and wellbeing for our clients. We so appreciate their help for making this possible.

Thankyou also for those many individual acts of kindness and generosity this year without this the project would be much poorer, as said before not only financially but in providing and fulfilling its role within the wider community. In these extreme times the picture is not all sweetness and light and cuts to funding go deeper. We are only small compared to some projects but offer huge value for money and have an amazing record for successful completions of our guys moving on to live successful productive lives.

Finally, I would like to thank our very committed trustees for their dedication and loyalty during these extreme times we could not do all this without your help and are grateful.

# Financial Review and Reserves Policy

The net surplus for the year was £1,649 all of which was in respect of unrestricted funds

The charity's total reserves at 31 October 2020 were £32,557 compared to £30,908 at 31 October 2019, all of which were unrestricted funds and the trustees consider that this is an adequate level of reserves to support both the ongoing work of the charity and its future development

#### 1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard Applicable in the UK and Republic Of Ireland (FRS 102), the Financial Reporting Standard Applicable in the UK and Republic Of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy notes.

1.2 Fund accounting policy

Unrestricted income funds are general funds that are available for use at the trustees' discretion in furtherance of the objective of the charity. Restricted income funds are available for use only in accordance with the donors' conditions under which the income was received.

1.3 Incoming resources

Voluntary income including donations and grants is recognised where there is entitlement, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

1.4 Resources expended

Liabilities are recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to the expenditure. All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to that category.

1.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life as follows:
