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REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

The Trustees have pleasure in submitting the Report and Accounts for the year ended 31 December 2019.

Summary of the charity's main activities and achievements

See appendix for full trustees' report.

In planning the activities the Trustees have applied the guidance on public benefit issued by the Charity Commission.

Financial review

During the year income increased by £2,500, to £56,100, and expenditure increased by £15,700, to £71,300. As a result the cash held by the charity decreased by £15,200, to £29,400, of which all is unrestricted and can be used for any charitable purpose.

Reserves policy

The trustees have determined that the charity should aim to hold unrestricted cash of no less than £10,000 or 3 months' of unrestricted expenditure (whichever is higher) so that the charity could continue to operate should income and / or expenditure vary adversely. At the year end, the charity held unrestricted cash of £29,400 and the charity is complying with its reserves policy.

Responsibilities of trustees

Charity law requires us as Trustees to prepare financial statements for each accounting year which record the receipts and payments of the charity for the year.

We are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable us to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011.

We also have a responsibility to safeguard the assets of the charity and to take reasonable steps to prevent fraud or any other irregularities.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT

TO THE TRUSTEES OF

LONDON CHURCH LEADERS

I report to the trustees on my examination of the accounts of London Church Leaders ('the charity') for the year ended 31 December 2019 on pages 4 to 7 following.

Responsibilities and basis of report

As the trustees of the charity you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ('the 2011 Act').

I report in respect of my examination of the charity's accounts carried out under section 145 of the 2011 Act and in carrying out my examination I have followed all the applicable Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act.

Independent examiner's statement - including a Matter of Concern identified

- I have completed my examination. I confirm that no material matters have come to my attention in connection with the examination giving me cause to believe that in any material respect:
- 1. accounting records were not kept in accordance with section 130 of the 2011 Act; or
- 2. the accounts do not accord with the accounting records.

In carrying out my examination, I noted a lapse in the keeping of accounting records relating to consultancy and other expenditure. Supporting documentation was not available for an amount of £2,981, as disclosed by the trustees in note 6 to the accounts. You have confirmed to me that the inability to produce the supporting documentation for these transactions is due to the organisation parting ways with its previous executive director and administrative consultant, but that an independent trustee was involved in approving such payments at the time. You have confirmed to me that robust measures have been taken to prevent a reoccurrence of this lapse in record-keeping and that there is no ongoing risk to the charity.

I confirm that there are no other matters in connection with the examination to which attention should be drawn in order to enable a proper understanding of the accounts to be reached.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

1 Accounting policies

The accounts have been prepared on a receipts and payments basis and comprise a statement that shows the charity's receipts and payments, a statement that summarises the charity's assets and liabilities and related notes. The accountancy profession have determined that only accounts prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards present a 'true and fair' view and, as these receipts and payments accounts have not (and cannot) be prepared in accordance with accounting standards, these accounts do not present (and are not intended to present) a 'true and fair' view of the charity's financial activities and state of affairs.

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity. Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the trustees for particular purposes. Restricted funds are donations which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors; they include donations received from appeals for specific activities or projects.

5 Transactions with related parties

No payments were made to any trustees or persons connected to them.

6 Events after the year-end

As noted in the trustees' report, since the year-end the organisation has parted ways with its previous executive director. As a result, it has also ended a separate consultancy arrangement for financial and administrative support. Administration is now taken care of internally by one of the members of the organisation (the London Baptists). Due to this change, the trustees have been unable to determine the nature of £942 worth of expenses, and certain relevant supporting documentation for a further £2,039, which relates to administrative consultancy payments. The trustees are satisfied that these gaps in supporting records are not indicative of a wider or ongoing breakdown in financial controls, and that sufficient measures have been taken to strengthen controls and record-keeping. The lack of records are noted in the independent examiner's report as a "Matter of Concern", although due to the limited nature and size of the amount involved it is not considered to be a serious incident requiring reporting to the Charity Commission.

London Church Leaders is a registered charity (1145750) governed by the constitution adopted on 8th September 2011.

The objects of the charity are as follows:

TO PROMOTE ANY CHARITABLE PURPOSE FOR THE PUBLIC BENEFIT IN LONDON BY BRINGING CHURCH LEADERS IN LONDON TOGETHER TO SUPPORT THE WORK OF THE CHURCHES IN FURTHERING THE OBJECT, PARTICULARLY (I) THE PREVENTION AND RELIEF OF POVERTY (II) THE CONSERVATION, PROTECTION, IMPROVEMENT OF THE PHYSICAL AND NATURAL ENVIRONMENT (II) THE PROMOTION OF RELIGIOUS AND RACIAL HARMONY (IV) THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE CAPACITY AND SKILLS OF THE SOCIALLY AND ECONOMICALLY DISADVANTAGED COMMUNITIES OF LONDON IN SUCH A WAY THAT THEY ARE BETTER ABLE TO IDENTIFY AND HELP MEET THEIR NEEDS AND PARTICIPATE MORE FULLY IN SOCIETY.

In practical terms, London Church Leaders is a Pan-London ecumenical body bringing together senior Christian leaders across the Capital to improve our co-working and engagement with wider societal issues through regular meetings with each other and various public figures.

Structure, governance and management

London Church Leaders is governed by the Trustees (listed overleaf) who oversee the day-to-day management of the charity, which includes the convening of the regular meeting of the Members of the charity (listed overleaf) and the facilitation of any special collaborative events. Trustees appoint from within themselves a chair, secretary and treasurer. From time to time, the trustees may seek to appoint paid staff to assist the administration and oversight of the charity. It is the responsibility of the Trustees to appoint new members of the charity – in consultation with existing members, through the 'co-chairs' of the members meeting (currently the Archbishop of Westminster and the Bishop of London). In the service of our ecumenical relationships, the Trustees are appointed from a range of denominations from Anglican (2), Roman Catholic (2), Free Churches (3) and black-led/new churches (2).

The Trustees set the level of financial subscription to the Charity from the member organisations/office holders which is the sole source of income. This income is expended in the employment of staff, the rental of office space, and the related expenses thereof in service of our charitable objects. Income is also disbursed in respect of members' subscriptions to Faiths Forum for London – and the support of the London Churches Refugee Network.

Achievements and charitable benefit

Members' Breakfast Meetings

Following the established pattern, these took place twice in the year.

20 March 2019: Presentation from Together for the Common Good and round table discussion. This began a process of looking at the future vision for London Church Leaders. We are seeking to deepen our relationships and improve our collaborative understanding of our work across the Capital.

17 October 2019 : Discussion of a renewed vision to be a forum for fellowship and shared endeavour and the place to which partners will come to 'engage with London's Churches.' LCL seeks to amplify and support the work of the churches in London. It compliments and does not replace the work of Churches Together.

At this meeting London Church Leaders welcomed ++Angaelos of the Coptic Orthodox Church for the first time as a guest.

Standing Together Rally

The Standing Together Rally in Trafalgar Square took place on Saturday 6th October. Participation in the rally, organised by the Ascension Trust, in support of anti-knife crime initiatives, was supported by LCL. LCL members and trustees joined in solidarity with this important matter of public interest.

Trustee Meetings

The Trustees met three times throughout the year and, in addition, conducted some business between meetings to ensure the Charity was well managed.

Staffing

Due to personal circumstances, the Executive Officer resigned with effect from 11 November 2019. It is not anticipated that a like-for-like appointment will be sought. The Trustees are consulting with the Members of the Charity over future staffing needs.

Impact of COVID-19

It is expected by the Charity Commission that trustees state the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the charity. Given the departure of our member of staff prior to the onset of the pandemic, the financial effects were minimal. The organisation of the charity was able to be administrated via Zoom. Trustee and breakfast meetings were held virtually during 2020 onwards. The virtual space proved extremely useful to connect with each other through lockdown and we actually had better attendance of members meetings as a consequence.
