THE CHARITY

St Joseph's School Association constitution was adopted in 1981. The Charity was registered with the Charity Commission in 1981 under registration number 286432.

RESERVES POLICY

Chair's Report for the period (1 September 2019 to 31 August 2020)

While the Covid-19 pandemic hit in March 2020, the year started very well and we had a strong and supportive team at the helm. We held all our regular fundraising activities for the first part of the year and even added a new one.

The new event was a Fitness Funday. It was a great success in that all participants had lots of fun while getting fit and the weather was gorgeous so we could make the most of our outdoor space. The SJSA spent the money raised on sports equipment which Coach Grant, our resident sports leader, proposed was needed – hockey kit, new football nets, balls, bats, bibs and a basketball hoop. It was great to raise money for a specific cause in this way, a big bonus for the much loved PE lessons. The money was combined with some funds carried over from the Auction in March 2019 where certain parents allocated funds for this worthy sports cause.

Our Winter Gala was a Carnival-themed night which included a Samba band and dancers. The organisers excelled themselves, and it was a fabulous night. Sadly, by March 2020 the world's focus was changing. Our planned Auction, which had already incurred a lot of work and planning, was postponed by a vote of the members the week before it was due to be held (21st March). As it later turned out, schools across the UK had to close on 20th March. It was such a huge shame and a big blow to our finances as this is always our biggest fundraiser of the year. The SJSA was able to subsequently raise money from some of the donated items, such as the class artworks (sold later during this financial year) and gifts from local businesses (totalling approx. £9,000 and sold after the financial year end). In total, £38,339 was raised during the financial year, compared to £133,947 in the prior year.

With reserves carried over from the previous year, SJSA managed to commit to historic levels of support for the school, donating £25,000 per quarter during the financial year. In addition to these core donations, on which St Joseph's relies to support educational enrichment including music and sport teaching, the SJSA also contributes where possible towards smaller items requested by the school during the year, such as Easter Eggs, school prizes and the leavers' party/yearbook.

Each year, the school has faced increasing financial constraints. As a school with one of the lowest pro-rata rates of funding from the Local Educational Authority (Westminster), the SJSA's role becomes even more important. Thanks to our generous local business and parent donors, and all our parental, extended family and teacher volunteers we can continue to provide support to St Joseph's.

The Trustees would like to thank our past Vice Chair Kim Kirchner and Treasurer Dede Tavares whose children left the school from September 2020. Liliana Hillebrand-Measures will also be handing over the reins as secretary but will continue to help us with necessary admin to run the SJSA which we really appreciate. Behind the scenes these Trustees worked super hard to promote and structure the SJSA and put many, many hours into making it the more structurally robust charity that it is today. Finally, I am sad to say that after seven years working closely with the SJSA, and two years as Chair, my children are reaching the upper years of the School and so I have decided to stand down at the Autumn Term 2021 AGM. This will allow an orderly handover to new parents of younger children to take the SJSA forward.

Thanks to all our gracious, helpful and generous parents for their time and money in helping the SJSA reach its targets to support the school.
