Objectives and activities

The pupose of the charity is to:

Promote, for the benefit of the residents of Gamesley and the surrounding areas, the preservation of good health by providing healthy and affordable meals in the interests of social welfare and with the objective of improving the conditions of life of those persons in need, and

Provide, or assist in the provision of, facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have the need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disability, financial hardship or social circumstances with the objective of improving

Delivering public benefit, achievements and performance

The cafe is now in its 16th year of operation. This has been a difficult year for us due to the Covid 19 pandemic.

Despite difficulties, we have continued to provide services to the communityand have remained open to takeaway throughout the second lockdown. We open each morning to provide a takeaway breakfast to local schoolchildren, which has been successful.

Our links with the community teams have continued. We still have links with the Connumity Mental Health Team and The Bureau in Glossop. We recently had our first socially distanced workshop with High Peak Community Arts; the first since the pandemic started.

We have maintained our links with the local GP and recently supported a pop-up vaccination programme on the estate.

We still support those with drug, alcohol and gambling addiction through social media.

We continue to offer nutritious, freshly home-made meals. We have given out food parcels throughout the pandemic, Supplying food to those in need. We continue to support those who are vulnerable and to the large number of the recently bereaved living on the estate, we have delivered comfort bags.

We have fifteen volunteers but during this last year many have been isolating due to age or vulnerability. We have therefore been operating with just one volunteer together with Nick and Donna to minimise risk of infection.

Our links with Marks and Spencer and Co-op supermarkets continue and we receive fresh fruit and vegetables which we can either cook or pass on to customers.

Financial review

Total income for the year to 31 March 2021 was £77,609, of which £29,927 was contributed by Government grants. Cafe turnover amounted to £23,025, with charitable grants and donations generating£23,657. Operating costs, including depreciation, amounted to £55,264, resulting in a surplus for the year of 22,345.

Principal funding sources

In addition to the income generated by the cafe, the charity's principal funding arises from voluntary giving by individuals who support the aims and objectives of the charity in the form of ad-hoc donations and committed monthly support. Ongoing support is also provided by High Peak Borough Council and occasional grants or donations from charitable or corporate bodies.

Reserves policy

Our aim is to mainyain a level of reserves sufficient to meet our financial obligations as and when they occur, Retained reserves amounted to £40,817 at the year end, which we regard as sufficient to enable us to continue, and further develop, our present level of operations.

Future plans

Our sessions with groups have had to be curtailed over the past twelve months but in July we hope to begin a Dementia Cafe in partnership with The Bureau, Glossop and a post-natal group for young muums and babies with the Health Visitors

Our Craft Group and Seniors' Lunch Club will resume and as soon as it is possible, we will continue to provide extra servises to the community.

Structure, governance and management

Governing document

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee. It was incorporated on 11 March 2008, registered as a charity on 20 August 2009 and commenced activities on 1 September 2009, taking over the operation of the Gamesley Community Cafe.

The company was founded under a Memorandum of Association, which established the objects and powers of the charitable company, and is governed in accordance with its Articles of Association. Membership of the company is open to: individuals or organisations who are members of the participating churches in the company and/or users of Cafe Jericho; apply to the charity in the form required by the directors; and are approved by the directors.

In the event of the company being wound up each member is required to contribute an amount not exceeding £10.

Appointment and retirement of trustees

The directors of the company are also trustees for the purposes of charity law. Under the provisions of the Articles of Association, directors must be aged 18 years or older and must number not less than 5. A person may be appointed to serve as a director provided they are willing so to act and have been proposed in the manner set out in the Articles. One director shall be the Minister in charge of one of the churches participating in the work or support of the charity and at least two others (or the majority, where the total number of directors exceeds 5) shall be members of the participating churches.

At each general meeting one-third of the directors, or the number nearest to one-third, must retire from office by rotation. A director retiring by rotation is eligible for re-election.

Organisational structure

The company is governed by a board of directors which meets regularly during each financial year and is responsible for policy making, strategy and supervising the operational activities undertaken by the cafe staff and volunteers. Management of day to day activities is devolved to the staff and volunteers.

Risk management

The directors have established policies and systems to mitigate risk, both financially and operationally, and these are reviewed on a regular basis to ensure they still meet the requirements of the company.

Declarations

The company has taken advantage of the small companies' exemption in preparing the report above.

1 Basis of preparation

1.1 Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared as a going concern under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant notes.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102 SORP) published on 16 July 2014 and with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) and with the Charities Act 2011.

2 Accounting policies

2.1 Income

Recognition of income

Income is include in the Statement of Financial Activities (SoFA) when the charity becomes entitled to the resources and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Offsetting

There has been no offsetting of assets and liabilities, or income and expenses.

Grants and donations

Grants and donations are only included in the SoFA when the general recognition criteria are met.

Legacies

Legacies are included in the SoFA when receipt is probable, i.e, when there has been grant of probate, the executors have established that there are sufficient assets in the estate and any conditions attached to the legacy are either within the control of the charity or have been met.

Tax reclaims on donations

Gift Aid receivable is included in income when there is a valid declaration from the donor. Any Gift Aid amount recovered on a donation is considered to be part of that gift and is treated as an addition to the same fund as the initial donation.

Donated facilities

Donated facilities are included in the SoFA when received at the value of the gift to the charity where that value can be measured reliably. The donated facilities are recognised as income with an equivalent amount recognised as an expense under the appropriate heading in the SoFA.

Volunteer help

The value of volunteer help is not included in the accounts but is described in the trustee's annual report.

2.2 Expenditure and liabilities

Liability recognition

Liabilities are recognised where it is more likely than not that there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources and the amount of the obligation can be measured with reasonable certainty.

Governance costs

Governance costs comprise all costs involving public accountability of the charity and its compliance with regulations and good practice.

Redundancy costs

No redundancy payments were made by the charity during the year.

Deferred income

No items of deferred income have been included in the accounts.

Creditors

Where applicable, creditors are measured at settlement amounts less any trade discounts.

Provision for liabilities

A liability is measured on recognition at its historical cost and then subsequently at the best

2.3 Assets

Tangible fixed assets for use by the charity

These are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year and cost more than £500. They are valued at cost and depreciated using the rates and methods disclosed in note 8.

Stocks

Goods held for sale as part of charitable trading activities are measured at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

Debtors

Debtors are measured on initial recognition at settlement amount and subsequently at the cash or other consideration expected to be received.
