Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Events included the Scouts doing the Monopoly Run in London in the Spring, just before the Pandemic forced the country into Lockdown.

The Group was able to run weekly meetings on Zoom during Lockdown and resumed water activities under Government safety guidelines, in the Summer of 2020.

All the usual fundraising events were cancelled, including the annual Fireworks, and the Duckathon. The Group ran a Virtual Lands End to John O'Groats sponsored walk that raised £480.

The Group received Covid Grants throughout the year and matched funding was obtained by some parents for £2.5K for their charitable voluntary time. The majority of these funds were used for building improvements to make the Hut Covid safe and to pay for equipment renewals.

The Group received a grant from Trinity House which enabled us to purchase Stand Up Paddle Boards, windsurfers, kayaks and to carry out much needed repairs on the boat sheds.
