1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Annual Report for the Year to 31 December 2020

The Trustees of St Paul's Church is registered with the Charity Commissioners (No 271505) and constituted by Deed of Trust.

The principal address of the charity is St Paul's Vicarage, 58 Abbotsbury Road, Weymouth, Dorset.

The Charity is administered by the trustees, comprising during the year:

Mrs S Weight, Mr C James, Mr D Harrison and Fr G Lipinski.

The Churchwardens of Weymouth St Paul are invited ex officio to all trustee meetings.

The object of the charity is to maintain the Hall, for the communal benefit of the inhabitants of the Parish and its surrounds. The management committee aims to provide first class hall facilities at an affordable cost to voluntary organisations serving the community.

This has been a particularly difficult year with the enforced closure of the church hall, due to the COVID pandemic throughout the world. England went into 'Lockdown' for long periods of time and this subsequently had a huge impact on our income.

The charity employs a part-time administrator and a part-time cleaner. The cleaner finished working for us in July 2020 and it was decided to hire contract cleaners, especially due to the current conditions.

The charity also depends greatly upon the continuing help of local volunteers.

This year the trustees made a charitable donation of £10,000 to St Paul's Parochial Church Council to assist with the payment of the deanery share.

Grants were received from Dorset Council of £7500 and £2634 from the Job Retention Scheme. Major expenses incurred this year were for the replacement of the flooring for £5521 and £1080 the essential replacement of the radiators at 49e.

The financial position of the charity is detailed in the attached accounts. The trustees are of the opinion that the results for the year are in agreement with the stated objects of providing a local facility at an affordable cost.
