Summary of the purposes of the charity as set out in its governing document	 Recognising Christ's commission to make disciples of all nations we, in God's strength, seek the advancement of the Christian faith as revealed in the Bible by: (i) Verbally presenting the person and work of the Lord Jesus Christ to members of the University. (ii) As a vital support to this we seek to unite and strengthen those who desire to serve Christ. (iii) We seek to be in God's work worldwide through his church. Therefore, the CICCU exists "to make Jesus Christ known to students in Cambridge."

We run a series of Friday talks which provide opportunities for any student to engage with the 'Big Questions' of life and investigate the claims of Christianity. We hold meetings intended for Christians, at both university and college levels, to support and encourage one another as we unite around the aim of proclaiming the message of Christ. We hold weekly prayer meetings for members.
	In February, we put on a week of talks (twice daily) to give the whole undergraduate body the opportunity to investigate the Christian faith. Other annual events include the Carol Services in December and welcome events for international students in September. Every year we arrange a 'Getaway' for members in order to encourage, equip, and support one another in the work of proclaiming the message of Christ. We also put on a range of events for members and non-members alike (which vary each year) to meet the objectives of our society.

	In the autumn we hosted a mini- Events Week in the form of a series of 3 talks, both to defend the Christian message against common objections and to proclaim actively the gospel of Jesus to students.

Notes to the accounts

CICCU holds money in a deposit account which is not currently used. It is reserved for safeguarding the charity's ability to keep functioning in the event of a fall in donations.

All funds received, paid, and held during the financial year 18^{th} March $2019 - 17^{th}$ March 2020 are unrestricted.

Receipts categories:

Donations from individuals – charitable donations from private individuals, mostly alumni of the society.

Grants from churches – grant payments received from churches that share the aims of the charity.

Getaways – payments from individuals attending the charity's three annual retreat events (a four-day retreat for the wider membership in January, a three-day retreat for college representatives in March and a three-day retreat for incoming first year undergraduates in September). This relates particularly to part (ii) of the charity's purposes.

Payments categories:

Getaways – costs of the aforementioned annual retreat events.

Main event week – costs of the annual main event mission week to which all members of the University are welcome. This relates particularly to part (i) of the charity's purposes.

Grants – payments made to organisations that share the charity's aims. This relates particularly to part (iii) of the charity's purposes.

Central events – costs of regular events outside of the main event mission week that the charity runs for its members and the wider membership of the University.

Fundraising:

CICCU receives funds from its members ('Internal Donations') and former members who have graduated ('External Donations') which both come under the category 'Donations from individuals'. Current and former members are informed of CICCU's financial situation through Finance letters issued three time a year. CICCU also receives some financial support from churches on a one-off basis.
