Mid Norfolk Foodbank is constituted as a stand-alone Charitable Incorporated Organisation and operates as a member of the Trussell Trust Network of foodbanks. Our policies and procedures are guided by the Operating Manual of the Trussell Trust and statutory legislation.

The Foodbank is registered with the Information Commissioner and Food Standards Agency.

The Trustees meet quarterly and are responsible for the strategic direction and policies of the CIO. The Trustees are also responsible for the financial and legal administration of the CIO. The Trustees are supported by a small management team of volunteers led by David Pearson. Michael Jones is retained on a self-employed basis as Operation Manager

The Foodbank is deemed to be a low risk project which can be terminated at short notice with no detriment to the charity or trustees. The accounts show that the annual operating costs of the Foodbank have been distorted by the Covid crisis but there are sufficient funds to sustain the project for at least 3 years for the benefit of local people in need.

Objectives and activities

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

The object of the CIO is:

- (1)To relieve persons in the United Kingdom and elsewhere in the world who are in conditions of need, hardship or distress (beneficiaries) in such ways as the trustees shall from time to time think fit.
- (2) Nothing in the Articles shall authorise an application of the property of the charity for purposes which are not charitable in accordance with section 7 of the Charities and Trustee investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and/or section 2 of the Charities Act (Northern Ireland) 2008

The principal purpose of Mid Norfolk Foodbank is to provide emergency food boxes to local people who have found themselves in financial crisis and unable to afford to buy food for themselves and their family.

This year has been a particularly challenging one with the continuing crisis over the Covid 19 pandemic. With the support of our amazing group of volunteers we were able to maintain our service to many more people in need. Although we were able to keep our 3 centres open during the lockdown we also made many home deliveries to people needing to self-isolate.

During this period we were supported by several supermarkets and were blessed with many donations of money, much of it from individuals who were unable to donate food.

Over the year we have given out food to around 3300 people, a decrease on the previous year. During the year we received 50 tons of food and gave out 48 tons in food parcels equivalent to114000 meals.

We have been supported throughout the year by a steady inflow of food donated by individuals, schools, churches and other organisations. We have also been supported by Tesco, Morrisons and Waitrose and the East of England Cooperative Society supermarkets, who have allowed us to collect food at the stores on occasions during the year. We particularly mention Tesco and Morrisons who have made bulk deliveries during the pandemic.

Due to restrictions on social contact imposed by the pandemic we had to suspend our engagement with Independence Matters although we are grateful for the continued availability of storage space at the centre. As a result we were able to secure a small industrial unit in Dereham as a warehouse, funded in part by Dereham Town Council and Breckland Council.

We are grateful to the Wellspring Family Centre in Dereham, the Baptist Church in Swaffham and the Salvation Army in Fakenham who continue to provide room for the Distribution Centres operated during the week, free of charge.

The Foodbank operates on a voucher scheme and the number of local care agencies issuing vouchers, such as the CAB, has steadily increased as we have become better known. We now have over 40 agencies, who deal with those in crisis in the local community, who can now issue a voucher that will feed those in

need. During the pandemic many of our agencies closed and we have instigated an electronic system for issuing vouchers.

The Trustees believe that Foodbank continues to be a real success, not only in serving local people, but also in bringing local churches together to serve their community in a simple and practical way.

The charity continues to raise the funds it needs to carry out its objects from a variety of sources including grants and donations. We are grateful for the support given in grants from Dereham In Need charity (food and fuel vouchers) and One Stop Shops (van hire).

The financial results for the year are set out in the accounts that accompany this report.

The Trustees have had due regard to the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit. They recognise that it is their responsibility to ensure that the benefits are offered in Dereham, Fakenham and Swaffham and the surrounding areas.

The Foodbank would not have been successful if it weren't for the continued support we have had from many of the local churches (but not exclusively) in providing volunteers who man the distribution centres and come to help in the warehouse. Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

- 1 Although extra pressure has been placed on the running of the Foodbank, the financial security of the project has been maintained through careful management of funds.
- Warehouse facilities have been provided with support from Dereham Town Council and Breckland Council
- Distribution Centres in Dereham, Swaffham and Fakenham have been provided rent free by Wellspring Family Church, Swaffham Baptist Church and Fakenham Salvation Army.
- 2. Mid Norfolk Foodbank's sole purpose is to collect food from local people and distribute it to other local people in need through emergency food boxes. Over the accounting period we have collected 50249 kg of non-perishable food and given out 47871 kg equivalent to114000 meals given out.
- 3. Over the year we have had a volunteer base of approximately 70 and a management team of 6. All volunteers and management give their time free of charge. There are no paid employees attached to the Foodbank although one volunteer is paid on a self-employed basis to carry out administrative duties and manage the warehouse on a part time basis.
