OTHER ASSETS

The General Fund has fixed assets comprising five sports pavilions and the Welfare House together with the land on which the sports grounds are set out. No formal valuation of the property has been conducted as it is not held for investment purposes but simply to allow the charity to fulfil its objects of providing a recreation ground for the inhabitants of Armthorpe in South Yorkshire.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020

The trustees present their report along with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2020. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP.

Constitution and Objects

The charity is constituted by a Scheme dated 14 March 2003 and was registered with the Charity Commission on 21 June 1963 under the number 523472.

Its objective is to provide a recreation ground for the benefit of the inhabitants of the village of Armthorpe near Doncaster, particularly (but not exclusively) those who are members of the mining community.

The charity is administered by trustees and those who have served the charity during the year are shown on page 1.

Review of Activities for the Public Benefit

2020 has come with many unique and extremely difficult challenges following the impact of the coronavirus pandemic. Murmurs of a new contagious respiratory disease began circulating as early as January whilst all sections of this scheme were beginning the new year as they normally would. However, as the virus picked up pace and started to spread, the UK entered a full national lockdown in March and all activity had to be suspended as the national message was to stay at home except for essential and emergency reasons.

It was first thought that a 3 week national lockdown would help to contain the virus and allow for a gradual re-opening of the country, but this turned out to be incorrect and most activity for all sub-sections of this scheme remained suspended right throughout the summer. This meant that the football seasons were declared null and void, and the entire band season was lost. No bowling could take place either.

National lockdown restrictions turned into local guidance and a tier system meaning there were times towards the end of the summer into Autumn that some very limited activity could restart. All sub-sections were subject to various covid 19 guidance which placed a significant pressure on volunteers to get things in place in order to be compliant and allowed to open. It is a credit to each volunteer of the various sub-sections with the amount of time and effort that was required, that each sub-section did manage to return to some form of activity for their members albeit in a limited fashion.

The financial impact felt across the world has also been felt by each sub-section due to losses in income whilst no activity could be provided but with bills still to pay. Again, credit must be paid to those volunteers who have worked through the minefield of obtaining financial support and keeping each sub-section stable whilst also meeting all covid 19 requirements and cost involved with that.

This report is normally filled with the achievements of each sub-section and the honours they have obtained during the year, but unfortunately, each section has been limited to training/practice/rehearsal/friendly matches with a sprinkling of competitive action that could not be concluded. What should be celebrated is the survival of the charity and it's sub-sections over the last 12 months thanks to the hard work of many volunteers giving up their own time on top of other personal commitments to continue to provide sport and recreation for the people of Armthorpe and surrounding areas.

At the time of writing, the UK is facing a further national lockdown entering 2021, but this time with the positive news of new vaccines to fight covid 19 being rolled out. There are still many challenging months ahead, but being optimistic, we should see a return of activity in 2021!

Investment Policy

The charity does not have an investment policy as such. The charity's liquid assets are held in a non- interest bearing bank account meaning that the money is instantly accessible to meet the charity's expenses.

Risk Management

The trustees are aware of the operational and financial risks which the charity faces and regularly reviews those risks to mitigate against any impact they may have on the charity.

Statement of Trustees' responsibilities

Law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the charity and of the incoming resources and

application of resources of the charity for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable

accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial

statements comply with the Charities Act 2011. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets

of the charity and for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.
