Aside from horse racing, we've introduced mushroom hunts, rainbow raffles, racing simulators, and more.

Arcobaleno Cancer Trust Grants

ACT grants are available to support groups and individuals affected by or working with cancer. Individuals can apply for an ACT grant if they are receiving treatment for cancer or or are still seriously affected by their illness or treatment

Arcobaleno Cancer Trust Race Night 2020

Due to the pandemic, this year's Race Night event was cancelled. However, we raised £ 19,694 via ticket sales/donations.

Arcobaleno Cancer Trust Grants -

In July 2020 ACT donated £18,800 to Dr Kate Newbold's development of a new technique for detecting and monitoring thyroid cancer using a simple blood test or 'liquid biopsy'. The report can be found here: https://mcusercontent.com/1ffc0c681bf7b6cc253015b88/files/bae33610-6cfc-32af-5502-

We also awarded £3,000 to Leukemia and Myeloma Research UK for a project developing a free stem cell storage service to families at risk of cancer. The goal is to offer vulnerable families the opportunity to store their baby's cord blood for 25 years in case the other child, or any other family member, may require it for treatment in future.

In July 2020, £4,744 was awarded to to Dr. Annels' team at the University of Surrey to support research investigating immunotherapies for bladder cancer.

Arcobaleno Cancer Trust Woodland Walk 2020

Completed our second woodland remembrance walk in Highgate woods raising awareness for Arcobaleno Cancer Trust and the work we are doing. We raised £900.00

Arcobaleno Cancer Trust Rainbow Challenges

Ava Terroni O'Hara completed a triathlon at the tender age of eleven and raised £2028.72 for ACT. £149.08 was also raised by two indivuduals planning to run the Brighton Marathon, however the event was a cancelled due to the pandemic.
