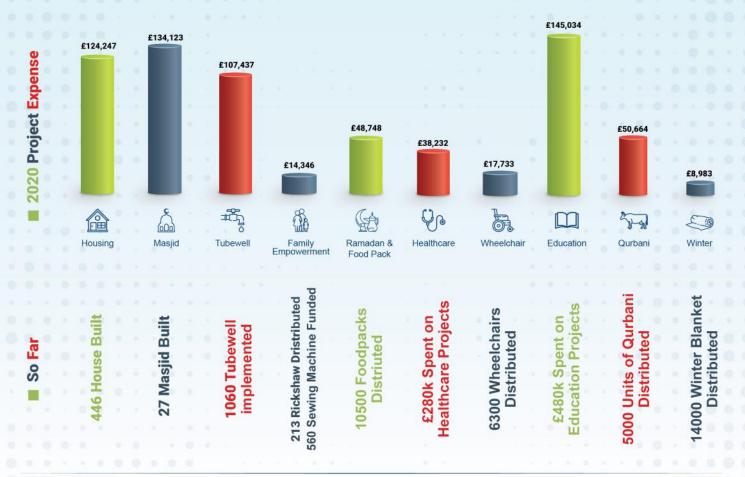

A decent house truly changes the feeble state of many poor and needy families to a better and comfortable situation. Housing is one of our flagship project and so far we have managed to provide housing to around 450 families Alhamdulillah. Most of our houses are standard two bedroom with a varenda which cost **£1500**.



We used to live in a very poor condition; our house was broken with no proper roof on top, in rainy season our whole house used to get wet continuously. We would like to thank Goreeb & Yateem for providing us with a proper shelter to sleep in. JazakAllah Khairan. - Hala Miah Our house got burnt down completely from a fire which appeared from a faulty electric cable. We were homeless for over a year staying in different people houses. Alhamdulillah end of 2020 GYFT constructed a beautiful house for me and my family with a kitchen and toilet facilities. - Abdul Wadud



Masjid is the hub of the community but in poorer community it is very difficult for them to put funds together to build a masjid so this is where we come in to support them. Alhamdulillah, so far we have built 27 masjids and we want to build more with your help and support. Price of each Masjid is £10,000 which will include full Masjid construction, a wudu area and toilet facilities.





















AFTER

We had a very small Masjid in our local community for everyone to pray and the condition was not too great. Alhamdulillah, now more than 100 people can pray in the Masjid at once. We are thankful to the donors for their gorgeous donation to construct a brand new Masjid with wudu and toilet facilities.

AFTER

Our Masjid was abandoned due to lack of funds as our area is really poor to get any work done. Alhamdulillah, we would like to thank the donor who has donated this beautiful Masjid which allowed us to pray 5 times a day and have morning Islamic classes for our children.



Despite Bangladesh being the land of water, poor families are still struggling to get access to easy and clean water as they often use unclean water from local ponds or lakes. Water Well is also one of our flagship projects and thanks to our generous donors and suporters we have been able to provide over 1,000 water pumps in many different districts of Bangladesh. Cost of each Tube Well (Hand Pump) is £250, around 4 to 5 families can benefit from it and a Deep Tube well is £950 which allows a small community to drink clean and fresh water.

We used to go far to get some fresh drinking water and as you have given us a tube well which we appreciate it massively. May Allah bless you for giving us the tube well and pray that Allah gives you more tawfig to donate.

Rasel Miah - Sunamgonj

Assalamu Alaikum, Goreeb & Yateem gave us a tube well, we are drinking fresh water now with our all family members. We suffered a lot without a tube well. We had to walk 15-20 minutes to collect water from ponds and sometime other houses which is too far from our home. Now we have 7-8 families around us and they can get benefit from this water well you provided.



One of the best way to take people out of poverty is to give them decent work or buy tools and equipments with which they can earn their own living. Alhamdulillah at Goreeb and Yateem we have managed to distribute over 200 rickshaws and around 600 sewing machines helping poor families to earn money with their own asset. The cost of each Family Empowerment Project are £250 for each Rickshaw, £180 for one Fishing boat and £70 for each Sewing Machine.



Sewing Machine Project

Me and kids were struggling to make ends meet due to COVID-19 as I was working in peoples houses to make living. While we were in lockdown with no work I had an opportunity to learn about tailoring.

Rickshaw Project I used to rent out a rickshaw to make a living for my family, which was very difficult as I used to pay half my earning for rental. Thanks to Goreeb and Yateem who provided me with a Rickshaw and now I can take full earning home and look after my family.



Ramadan can be a very difficult month for poor people to find day jobs as work slows down and can be limited and many poor family will struggle to feed their loved ones. A foodpack gift with essentials is assuring for the poor families. 2020 saw us distribute 2,600 Ramadan and Family Foodpacks and so we have distributed over 10,000 food parcels. Cost of each Ramadan and Family food pack is £30 which allows a family of 4 to feed for 30 days.



I was worried for the month of Ramadan, as I have lost my job due to COVID-19. Thanks to Goreeb & Yateem Trust Fund for providing Ramadan foodpack for me and my family as it allowed us to keep our fast in the blessed month. I am an elderly mother and have 2 disable kids at home and in the month of Ramadan it becomes difficult to put iftari on the plate. Thanks Goreeb and Yateem for looking after me for the last 5 years.



Free Healthcare facility and provision is very limited in Bangladesh and many poor people can not afford basic medical provision. Alhamdulillah, we have been providing Blind Support, Cataract, around 10 Individial Medical Support and Disability support to poor and needy families in different parts of Bangladesh. In 2020 we have spent around £40k on medical project and so-far we have spent around £280k. Cost of each cataract surgery is £50.















INDIVIDUAL MEDICAL FEEDBACK



This is Mumena Begum (on the right) who comes from a village called Jamshi (Sindur Khan, Sremangal, Moulvibazar). She has been suffering from a tumour in her throat which has been affecting everyday life. After being hospitalised and going through treatment. Momena has recovered and is now able to drink and swallow food without having severe pains.

Mumena Begum and her family have passed on their thanks to those who have come to their aid and all those who have helped the thousands of other people in Bangladesh.



This is Mohammed Muktar Miah who comes from a village called Narain Sora (Hamidnagar, Sremangal, Moulvibazar). Whilst carrying out some work he fell from a tree and fractured his right leg. After being hospitalised and going through treatment, Muktar is on a road to recovery and is now able to walk with the help of crutches.

Mohammed Muktar Miah has passed on his gratitude and has asked everyone to keep him in their prayers whilst he is recovering.



This is Mohammed Parvez Ahmed who comes from a village called Hajipur (Hamidnagar, Sremangal, Moulvibazar). He has had problems with his mental health and a problem with his speech. He has been hospitalised and doctors are working on treating him.

Mohammed Parvez Ahmed has not been able to pass on a message but his parents are grateful for the support that they have received and pray that their son recovers soon.

Wheelchair is a great way to get mobile for disabled people. In 2020 we funded over 300 wheelchairs for disabled people and so far we have distributed around 6,300 wheelchair. Cost of each Wheelchair is £70.

EDUCATION



A good edcuation with a good upbringing is very important for people in developing country to truly come out of poverty and reliase their full potential. Alhamdulillah, Goreeb and Yateem has been supporting many education projects in UK and Bangladesh since the beginning. In 2020 we have spent close to £150k to help and support various education projects including our support for Blind and Orphan students. £300 will provide one year support. Poor people look forward to Qurbani so they can receive and eat some meat. Goreeb and Yateem has been carrying out Qurbani project for a long time and in 2020 we carried out around 1,000 units of Qurbani and Akikah. Look out for our Qurbani project detail and price closer to the time.



Winter is a tough time for poor people as their living condition are not very good for adequate heating. In 2020 over 1,000 blanket was distributed by Goreeb and Yateem to poor and needy families to keep them safe from cold. We have distributed around 14,000 winter blankets so far. Other projects include wheelchair distribution, winter clothing distribution, sewing machine distribution among poor women, orphan sponsorship, Qurbani projects and financial support for widowed women. The charity continues to provide humanitarian assistance to those who need it most with the aim to empower society, and invest in the educational needs of the future generation of Bangladesh.

The organisation currently has 10 Trustee board members. The Trustees are elected and operate in accordance with the Trust Deed and Governing constitution of the charity.

The trustees are responsible for preparing the annual report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations. The trustees are required to maintain adequate accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy the charity's financial transactions.

Goreeb & Yateem Trust Fund works with delivery partner organisations towards achieving common goals. These include educational institutions as well as other non governmental organisations.

ANNUAL REPORT 2020

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Fixtures and fittings
Computer equipment

20% on cost
25% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
