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TRUSTEES' REPORT

The objective of the Bishop Seth Ward Almshouse Trust is to help house underprivileged mature adults in Buntingford, Hertfordshire. The Trust invests in properties to raise funds to support the running and maintenance of the Almshouses.

Financial Review

The accounts show an overall surplus in the year of £54,765 (compared to 2019 £36,924). Income increased in the year as the rental properties achieved full occupancy in the year and the interest from fixed term deposits matured and was paid in 2020. Maintenance costs decreased significantly on both the Almshouses and Chapel End properties.

Achievements and performance

The Trust continues to provide housing for mature adults on a low income in the local community. The Trustees were able to significantly reduce the outgoings this year and increase the financial reserves to support the long-term plans.

Future plans and reserves policy

The Trust continue to review its aims and objectives to ensure the Almshouses are affordable and attractive within the community. The Trustees have instructed a Long Term Maintenance Plan to be carried out in order to review the current reserve policy. The replacement of the roof of the building is estimated to be around £500,000 and cash reserves are still short of this target.
