The Objects of the CIO are:

- 1) For the benefit of the public to further the conservation and preservation of the hedgehog species in Gloucestershire.
- 2) For the benefit of the public to relieve the suffering and distress of hedgehogs in need of care and attention by providing a rescue, care and rehabilitation service for sick, injured, or orphaned hedgehogs with the aim of releasing such hedgehogs back into the wild wherever possible.
- 3) To advance the education of the public in the study of hedgehogs and in the care, methods of treatment, conservation and habitat of hedgehogs.

Brockworth Hedgehog Rescue research, rescue, rehabilitate and release native european hedgehogs in order to support and preserve the species for the public benefit.

We give talks on our work with hedgehogs to the public including schools, care homes, community groups and similar organisations.

In shaping our objectives for the year and planning our activities, the trustees have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit, including the guidance 'public benefit: running a charity (PB2)'. The charity relies on grants and the donations to cover its operating costs.

## Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

This financial year has been like no other with the impact of Covid. The rescue took a record number of hedgehogs in, with 436 hedgehogs through our doors (compared to 252 the year before). In addition to this the covid restrictions meant that we were working on half the number of volunteers, and for 3 months with no volunteers at all.

The impact of people being at home meant that the sick hedgehogs were being seen and were brought in.

Covid also had an impact on our fundraising so we had to turn to other ways of raising money, 2 volunteers started making masks to sell and this brough it over £2500, we also did more online fundraisers including an auction.
