STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing Document

The King's Royal Hussars Museum CIO was registered with the Charity Commission on 24th June 2020 with the Registered Charity Number 1190086 and constituted by a signed Constitution of The King's Royal Hussars CIO also dated 24th June 2020.

Following this, the Museum of the King's Royal Hussars in Lancashire (14th/20th King's Hussars) Registered Charity Number 272107 was merged with The King's Royal Hussars Museum in Winchester Trust Registered Number 271942 in order to initially merge both KRH collections prior to their subsequent merger into the new CIO detailed above.

Organisational Structure

The trustees listed above have overall control and manage the CIO. They meet formally twice a year and Minutes from the Meetings are held in the Minutes Book. The King's Royal Hussars (serving Regiment) is represented by the Adjutant who is an ex-officio trustee. The staff of the charity comprise the Hon Curator/Secretary who is employed part-time in this appointment, a full-time Museum Assistant/Archivist, and an Administrative Officer who carries out part-time secretarial support. All are funded by MOD(A), which also provides the building and utilities at no cost to the charity.Volunteer staff assist in caring for the Collection, opening the museum on weekends and public (bank) holidays and when the sole Museum Assistant is working on the Collection, attending training or absent on leave.

Connected Charities

The charity is connected with the King's Royal Hussars Officers' Trust (No: 1052828) and the C B Wilson Bequest (No: 200524), both registered charities, by virtue of some common trustees. The independence of the charity is ensured due to there being a majority of trustees who serve only as trustees of the KRH Museum CIO..

Risk Management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and Aims

The objects of the charity are to educate the public and members of the Regiment in the history and military accomplishments of the former Regiments, to promote military efficiency and encourage recruitment by public exhibition of the Collection in a Museum or Museums or such other places as the charity trustees may from time to time decide, and to conserve, restore, repair, re-construct and preserve articles in the Collection.

Public Benefit

The trustees have given serious consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the CIO's aims and objectives and in planning activities. This year, despite opening restrictions imposed due to COVID-19, some public benefit has been achieved by hosting and teaching a limited number of organised groups of schoolchildren, answering research enquiries and public access to archives.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

The museum has had an unsatisfactory and frustrating year due to the COVID-19 pandemic, which resulted in prolonged closure and restricted access when allowed to open. On the upside museum staff and volunteers have made good progress with the physical sorting, assessment and resulting decisions associated with the merger of the two Collections prior to deciding which items will be placed on public display. The Museum Assistant and the HHQ office continue to receive and deal with research enquiries.

The museum's acquisitions during the year have included a First World War era 10th Hussar Brodie Steel Helmet, medal groups of General Henry Edward Doherty 14th Light Dragoons, Major P T Drew 14th/20th King's Hussars SSM Ronald Ernest Bowen 10th Hussars and Sergeant Ken Dowding 14th/20th King's Hussars plus a large number of photographs, various books, service records and documents of former members of all our antecedent Regiments.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

During this period several exhibits have been refreshed, including updating the modern era showcase, new displays in the temporary showcase and improvements to the medal collection. Guided by the preventative conservation audit, some minor changes were made in a number of showcases.

The museum website is undergoing a major refurbishment including the introduction of an historical timeline which will be regularly refreshed and a 360• virtual tour of the museum. The use of images and short vignettes are published each month on the Museum's website, Facebook page and Twitter feed which are collectively proving very successful in generating greater interest in the Museum, especially during the periods of COVID-19 Lockdown. We hope this will trigger an increasing number of actual visits in the future.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The CIO recorded a surplus of £83,025 during this financial year, primarily resulting from the merger of both Museum Collections at the start of this period and converting the investment portfolio into cash which proved to have been sensible as it avoided the worst effects of the economic downturn resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.
