What We Do

The Trustees confirm that they have complied with the duty in section 4 of the Charities Act 2006 to have due regard to public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission.

Youth Sailing Charity London was established and gained charitable recognition on the 11th June 2019 as a watersports charitable trust based in the greater London area.

The primary objective of the Charitable Trust is:

To promote community participation in healthy recreation for the public benefit by organising or providing or assisting in the organisation or provision of facilities and access to sailing and water-Sports within London.

Who Benefits?

We are part of a living community within the greater London area and whilst our charitable activities are for young people from all backgrounds, we also plan to encourage their families to get involved, taking a whole family approach to supporting young people. Our aim is to bring this living community together for the benefit of young people, who benefit from the skills, experiences, opportunities, and in-kind support from older volunteers.

Who We Are?

We are a group of volunteers who are involved in watersports at various levels for many years throughout Greater London.

Our Resources and Working in partnership

We do not own and or lease any property or equipment but have developed extensive working relationships and partnerships with many watersport centres around London who will support out charitable activities for young people.
