### TRUSTEES REPORT

### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020

### Structure, governance and management

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a church constitution dated 24 June 2013 and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

The method of appointment of the charity members is set out in the Church Rules. At The Bethel Evangelical and Independent Church, Clapham, North Yorkshire, the membership of the charity consists of the elders and deacons.

The managing trustees are responsible for making decisions on all matters of general concern and importance to the charity including deciding on how funds of the charity are to be spent. The managing trustees must hold at least 4 meetings in each 12 month period.

Once a new managing trustee has been appointed they shall be provided with a copy of:

- the latest annual report and accounts of the church
- the constitution and church rules
- any other relevant documentation relating to the property of the church

The property owned by the charity is held in the names of all the trustees.

### **Objectives and activities**

The charity has considered the Commission's guidance on public benefit and, in particular, the specific guidance on charities for the advancement of religion. The principal objectives are:

- the advancement of the Christian faith in accordance with the Basis of Faith primarily but not exclusively within Clapham, North Yorkshire and the surrounding area
- such other charitable purposes as shall, in the opinion of the managing trustees further the work of the charity

## Achievements and performance

During the year the charity has held regular church services and has 30 members. The charity continues to allow its facilities to be used free of charge for church members and the community. These include:

- fellowship meetings and Bible Studies every Tuesday
- monthly coffee meetings during the winter on Thursdays
- monthly fellowship meetings on a Thursday
- monthly senior citizens meetings on a Thursday
- mums and tots facilities every Friday (except school holidays)
- 6-9 year olds playgroup every 2 weeks on a Friday (except school holidays)
- 10+ children's "Encounter,, group every 2 weeks
- a Knit & Knatter group to use the Chapel every other Monday afternoon

These are all held in the church hall and are a benefit to the community as a whole. Unfortunately due to Covid-19, the above ran from January 2020 until the March 2020 lockdown and have not taken place since then.

### TRUSTEES REPORT (CONTINUED)

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020

From March 2020 the charity has however been able to do the following:

- a free Christmas afternoon tea for retired people from the local community delivered to their home
- a virtual coffee morning which raised £185
- weekly zoom prayer meetings
- activity packs sent via mail to the children from K Motion (aged 4-9) and Encounter (aged 10+) several times during the year as we were not able to meet face to face
- a treasure hunt for families to complete by themselves sent via post
- free Christian books and literature left outside Bethel Chapel for anyone to take
- a monthly collection of food, which was donated to Skipton Foodbank
- a free summer afternoon tea delivered Covid securely to senior citizens homes

#### **Financial review**

Total receipts on unrestricted funds were £28,947 and the net result for the year was an excess of receipts over payments of £322.

Adding bank balances brought forward at the beginning of the year, the balance carried forward at  $31^{st}$  December 2020 on unrestricted funds totalled £27,612. The present level of reserves is adequate to support the present activities of the charity however this shall be reviewed regularly by the managing trustees.
