The rise in operating profits has been due to Government assistance with JRS, along with active fundraising, during the Covid-19 pandemic and its associated shut-downs but does not seriously affect HACA's going concern status.

Financial reserves are mainly from operational activities generated in the profit and loss account that are carried over year on year. The charity is a non-profit organisation that exists to serve the sociocultural needs of the Hilldrop area community and one of our core funding is Restricted grants provided by the Islington Council.

A description of the principal risks facing the charity	Para 1. 4 6	The challenges posed by COVID-19 on our organisation: On 23 rd March 2020 we had to suspend all services and implemented COVID19 secure measures to reopen 4 weeks later with an emergency food service that has been operating throughout the pandemic. 6 of our 9 employees were furloughed in April and we are gradually reintroducing services following government guidance and protective measures, however we are far from

	reaching our previous capacity and this is likely to continue for the rest of the current year. HACA faces loss of income totalling approx. 50% of our annual turnover during 2020-21. To mitigate the impact this will have on our viability we have been active in seeking out and successfully applying for a range of COVID19 Response funds. These funds address our loss of income generation and provide for continued delivery of priority services to meet the needs of our community at this time. Some of the funding that has so far been successful are: 10k from LRCF Wave 2 (City Bridge Trust), 20k National Lottery, 1.2k Shell UK donation, 5k Pot E discretionary grant, and additional funds for our play project as it delivers frontline work at reduced capacity and increased risk. Aside from the financial implications of the pandemic, an additional challenge is the change to the way we work; our mission to bring our community together, enabling social connectedness, and our community centre being a hub of activity, is not possible at this time. We need to operate remotely and individually whilst sustaining the community networks we have established.
