# **PCC Annual Report 2019**

### Explanatory note

As a result of the Coronavirus crisis in 2020 which included the closure of church buildings, a national lockdown, and an extended timetable for the conduct of Annual Parochial Church Meetings and Annual Meetings of Parishioners, this report of the activities of the PCC is shorter than usual and has not yet been presented to the Annual Parochial Church Meeting, along with the other reports that would normally be presented at that meeting.

# Aims and Purposes

St James Parochial Church Council (PCC) has the responsibility of co-operating with the incumbent in promoting in the ecclesiastical parish, the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical.

The PCC of St James is responsible for the maintenance of the parish church of St James.

# Objectives and Activities

The PCCs are committed to enabling as many people as possible to worship at our churches and to become part of the parish community of St James. Our services and worship put faith into practice through prayer and scripture, music and sacrament.

When planning our activities for the year, we have considered the Commission's guidance on public benefit and, in particular, the supplementary guidance on charities for the advancement of religion. In particular, we try

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to enable ordinary people to live out their faith as part of our parish community through:

- Worship and prayer; learning about the Gospel; and developing their knowledge and trust in Jesus.
- Provision of pastoral care for people living in the parish.
- Missionary and outreach work.

To facilitate this work it is important that we maintain the fabric of the .

#### Achievements and Performance

In March we held a service of Thanksgiving for the restoration of the church building. During the year an updated history of St James was published as was a suite of new heritage leaflets. Discussions continue on the masterplan for the church building.

During the year we said farewell to the Reverend Simon Lewis, Dean of the St Anselm's Community, on the completion of his curacy in the benefice. In July, St James hosted the Woolwich Episcopal Area ordinations, at which our curate, the Reverend Jacob Mercer, was ordained to the presbyterate by the Bishop of Southwark

# Worship and Prayer

Services of worship take place on Sunday mornings at 10.30am. In addition there are Prayer Meetings each month on Sundays for seasons of six months at time, as well as a regular weekly act of Morning Prayer on Tuesdays at St Anne's. During the year a new regular act of worship, Wednesday Night Church, was started at St James for people across the United Benefice. Each evening included a meal, bible teaching and discussion, and concluded with singing and a prayer.

The total number of funeral services conducted by the United Benefice in 2019 was 30, of which 8 were at St James, 2 were at St Anne's, and the remainder were at crematorium or cemetery chapels.

There were ten marriages and twenty-eight baptisms.

### **Deanery Synod**

Lay representatives of the Deanery Synod are also members of the PCC. This provides the PCC with an important link between the parish and the wider structures of the church. A report on the activities of the Deanery Synod will be submitted to the Annual Parochial Church Meeting.

## Mission and Evangelism

We are committed to sharing the Gospel of God's grace with our community in word and deed.

### **Ecumenical Relationships**

St James and St Anne's church are members of Christians for Transformation in Bermondsey and Rotherhithe, an informal network of churches of various denominations that work together in the area in the work of mission.
