## YEAR ENDED 31<sup>ST</sup> MAY 2021

The Trustees present their report and unaudited financial statements of the Charity for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> May 2021.

#### **Principal activities**

The promotion of social inclusion among disabled people from BAME communities in the Northeast of England who are socially excluded from society, or parts of society, as a result of their disability and assisting them to integrate into society.

## **Aims and Objectives**

New Hope Northeast aims to provide:

- education, information, and opportunities designed to support and enable disabled people to maximise their potential.
- public awareness of the issues affecting disabled people, both generally and in relation to their social exclusion.
- support groups, forums, advice, advocacy and general support for disabled people and their families/carers.
- recreational and leisure time activities for disabled people, their families/carers, provided in the interest of social welfare with the object of improving their conditions of life and developing their skills, capacities, and capabilities.

#### **Activities Provided**

#### 1. Parents forum

A safe and supportive platform for families to engage, share experiences, information, advice, guidance, learn new skills; invite Local Authority/private sector professionals to come and talk to families about provisions available, and ask questions to meet needs.

## 2. Children's/Young people various activities

After school club; Arts and Crafts, Creative Story writing; Music/dance; Cooking/Baking; reducing isolation, having fun, making friends, and raising self-esteem.

## 3. Gardening/Cooking lessons

Allocated space by South Tyneside Council, parents/carers and children/young people engage in growing organic vegetables, learn about nature. Cooking healthy food tackling health issues such as obesity/diabetes, and others.

## 4. Physical fitness

Inclusive Families Zoom "Bootcamp Workout.

Physical fitness for the whole family to keep fit during lockdown and after.

## 5. Family Day trips

We organize day trips/outings to various historic sites, farms, beaches, museums, theme parks, and autistic friendly cinemas. Most BAME families are from low income and unable to afford holidays, hence the need for them to cover the gap.

## Financial Review

During the year ending 31 May 2021, income totalled £47,796 and expenditure totalled £35,562, giving an overall surplus for the year of £12,234

**Accounting Policies** 

#### **Basis of Accounting**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015).

#### Income

The income shown in the Statement of Financial Activities account represents the grants and donations received during the year and b/forward figure from year 2019/2020 accounts.

#### 1. Gardening

This Charity runs a gardening project. The money spent includes gardening materials, seeds, fees for photos and videos.

#### 2. Physical Fitness

Total amount spent on sessions and equipment's

#### 3. Professional Fees

Mostly professional fees for workshop delivery

#### 4. Computer Equipment

Laptops and tablets for families. To help with online activities in the comfort of their home due to the pandemic lockdown and inability to do face to face activities.

#### 5. Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost or valuation of an asset, less its residual value, over the useful economic life of the asset as follows:

Office Equipment - 15%

#### 6. Fixed assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. The cost of minor additions or those costing below £250 are not capitalised.

#### 7. Accounts payables

Accounts payables are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party. The amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably.
