Para 1.17 and 1.19	The Chew Valley Lake Recreational Trail (CVLRT) will develop, maintain and run a recreational off-road walking and cycling route of regional significance around the Chew Valley Lake. The organisation will provide significant benefit to communities in the local and surrounding area through allowing open access to this natural amenity for all. The recreational trail will be free to use and as such cyclists and walkers will be able to benefit from an enhanced outdoor leisure activity and experience through the well designed, interpreted and maintained accessible route, irrespective of their youth, age, infirmity, disablement, financial hardship or social circumstances. The benefits of the CVLRT will include opportunities for increased health and wellbeing (through formal and informal exercise); space to engage with nature and the surroundings (alleviating mental health problems and increasing awareness and protection of the environment); opportunities for local

		engagement and personal development (through volunteering, work experience and partnership working with other voluntary sector organisations).

Achievements and Performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity, identifying the difference the charity's work has made to the circumstances of its beneficiaries and any wider benefits to society as a whole.	The charity was established to support fund raising and grant applications for the new recreational trail which would ultimately lead to the CIO running and managing the trails once constructed. Through its involvement in its founding year, the charity has supported one of the project partners to secure funding for part of the trails delivery through the EU Rural development funding for the off road section of the trail. In this second year of the CIO, in which activity was curtailed due to the Covid-19 pandemic, further funding was secured by one of the project partners to deliver the 'on road' section of the trail. The CIO was able to support this application but remains as an organisation who will be managing the trail once all of the construction work is completed. Despite the pandemic, and outside the period of this annual return, construction commenced in August 2021 and is due for completion in Spring

2022. The completed trail will offer free access to nearly 7km of off-road trail suitable for all types of pedestrian, buggy and cycle use which will allow users to experience the recreational trail who will be able to benefit from an enhanced outdoor leisure activity and experience through the well designed, interpreted and maintained accessible route, irrespective of their youth, age, infirmity, disablement, financial hardship or social circumstances.

During the pandemic this type of exercise has been recognised as of value to society as demonstrated by the increased level and activity of people getting outside to spend time outside and in the environment.

The trustees recognising this new emphasis and opportunity for 'getting outside' are seeking additional funding to undertake activity in relation to the running and management of the completed trail and the charity will continue to support these efforts.
