REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS, ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

As a Community Church we have continued to further our vision to promote faith in Jesus Christ by adapting to the circumstances and restrictions due to the pandemic that hit in March 2020. We maintained a regular Sunday service and Wednesday prayer meeting designed for prayer, worship, communion and fellowship all online via Zoom. As a Church, we regularly connect through our daily "verse for the day" WhatsApp group and share thoughts and prayer requests that help all our members stay connected and supported. As a leadership, we started to post daily videos of thoughts/messages filled with encouragement, teaching and prayers. We continued to protect and support those who were most vulnerable by not having any in person meetings until government guidelines meant there were no restrictions, and it was safe to meet again. In December 2020, our CAP Centre closed after many years of supporting those in our community who struggled with debt and food deprivation.

The Church continues to provide volunteers and support to Merseyside Christian Youth Camps who provide Christian based holidays for children, teenagers, and adults from across the region. Members of the church were involved with online events to support those young people who would normally attend these camps in the summer. We have also worked more closely alongside Ykids, a local Children's Charity, to help and support the young people in the area. The church building was used to hold and create multiple food parcels and children's activity packs throughout the year during lockdown. The building is normally used by the church and the community for events, activities, education training etc. The usage of the building has been limited due to the pandemic, but we have discussed increased future access from requests we have received via various people and local organisations wanting to have use of the building on a regular basis and for one off events. The Church has also made a presence in the local cemetery during important annual events to offer support and prayer which we have seen continue to develop over the year. This was put on hold to the restrictions.

The church has continued to prayerfully and financially support many pastors and missionaries abroad and also support the church leadership through developing skills and training which will directly impact our church members in a positive way. There was a greater need for this during the difficult year that many people faced.
