## **1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

#### **Charity information**

Ivan and Rebecca Twigden Charitable Trust is an unincorporated charity registered in the United Kingdom. The principal office is Vernon House, 26 New Street, St Neots Cambridgeshire PE191AJ.

#### **Accounting convention**

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (effective October 2019) - (Charities SORP FRS 102), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

The trust constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS102.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest pound.

The financial statements are prepared on a cash basis as the income of the charity is less than £250,000. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

#### **Going concern**

The Trustees consider that there are no material uncertainties about the Trust's ability to continue as a going concern.

## Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

#### Incoming resources

Voluntary income received by way of donations and gifts is recognised when received.

## Gift aid

Gift Aid and other income received by the charity in respect of which a claim for repayment of tax has been made is grossed up for the tax recoverable and this gross amount recognised in the receipts and payments account.

#### Financial instruments

The charity only has basic financial instruments measured at amortised cost, with no financial instruments classified as other, or basic financial instruments measured at fair value.

#### **Resources expended**

Expenditure in relation to donations is recognised on a cash basis.
