		During the year a group of Sisters from the order went from England to work in Germany as nurses. They chose to donate their surplus salary to this charity so that is might support the wider charitable activities of the order across the world. This shows a one significant donation of £14,058 in June 2020.
		During this year funds have been transferred to support the work of the communities in India, specifically to help meet medical expenses of terminally ill sisters, to help meet the expenses of homes run by the sisters for orphaned and poor girls and to help with the effects of the pandemic on schools in poor rural areas.

Para 1.20	During the year the Trust has been able to send £28,000 to support the charitable activities of the order of the Daughters of St Francis de Sales in India. The trustees have kept in touch with the order, so as to assess the needs for funds and agree with the superiors of the order the priorities for the use of the charitable funds. There are agreed priorities for the transfer of further funds, but at the year end there were restrictions in place which make the transfer of funds to meet the priorities in India very difficult, therefore the charity is delaying further transfer until these restrictions are eased.

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	Para 1.21	A balance of donations is held at the yearend as outlined above, the top priorities for this money would be to meet needs in India for living costs and education of poor girls in a girls home in Bangalore and to purchase furniture for a home for deaf and dumb children in Andhra Pradesh These needs will be kept under review during the coming year and grants made as soon as money transfer becomes easier.


