St Albans. In addition, we run a minibus to provide transport for our day

centres and day centres run by other voluntary groups in the City and

District. In providing for the elderly (particularly those with mobility

problems) who would otherwise be confined to their homes we believe

we are making a significant contribution to addressing isolation and

loneliness suffered by this vulnerable section of the community.

We also organise subsidised chiropody services for those attending day

centres throughout the City and District: this service bridges a gap between the service provided by the NHS and services that have to

be paid for privately.


