The trustees present their report and accounts for the period ended 30 April 2020.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the CIO's constitution dated 30 April 2019, the Charities Act 2011 and the Statement of Recommended Practice, "Accounting and Reporting by Charities", issued in March 2005.

Structure, governance and management

The CIO was established by a charitable trust deed on 30 April 2019.

New trustees are recruited in accordance with the constitution through assessment of appropriate skills and knowledge and appointed by resolution.

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the CIO is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

Objectives and activities

The CIO's objects are to promote the rehabilitation of those recovering from addictions to drugs, alcohol and other addictions.

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the CIO should undertake.

Achievements and performance

During it's first year the CIO was able to raise funds through donations and quiz nights. The CIO has a trading subsidiary, ARTS Fundraising Limited, which sells sports memorabilia and donates its profits.

The income generated allowed the trustees to ensure that activities such as a golf day and boxing night were run to support their beneficiaries.

Financial review

The CIO generated total funds of £11,843 and expended a total of £3,331 leaving unrestricted reserves at the year end of £8,512.

The level of reserves held at the year end represent 72% of income generated but the trustees consider this reasonable in the CIO's first year.

Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deeds of covenant is recognised at the time of the donation.
