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#### **Trustees' Annual Report**

#### For the year to 31 March 2021

South West Support and Awareness Group (Charity No.1178353) is a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) and was established on the 11 May 2018 with the Charity Commission for England and Wales. The principle address is 19 Windermere Crescent, Derriford, Plymouth, Devon PL6 5HX. The charity operates under the name of SWASAG.

#### Objects of the charity

The objects of the charity are:-

- (a) to preserve and protect the physical and mental health of sufferers of asbestos related illnesses within the geographic area of the South West of England, through the provision of financial assistance, support, education and practical advice, in particular but not exclusively to:
  - (i) help improve the living conditions and quality of life of sufferers;
  - (ii) develop local support groups; and
  - (iii) bring together in conference and work in liaison with representatives of voluntary organisations, government departments, local and other statutory authorities and individuals.
- (b) to advance the education of the general public, within the geographic area of the South West of England, in all areas relating to asbestos related illnesses including but not exclusively by providing information about the hazards of asbestos in the environment, and how to obtain reparations and other funds.

#### **Public Benefit**

The trustees have had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit and believe the main activities undertaken to further the charity's purposes for the public benefit.

#### Structure, governance and management

The charity's governing document is the CIO foundation model agreed by the applicants on 1 May 2018 and registered with the Charity Commission for England and Wales on 11 May 2018.

The trustees are selected on the basis of their skills, knowledge and experience needed for the effective running of the charity.

Trustees are appointed for a period of three years except in the first year where it can be for less. There must be at least three trustees.

#### Main activities in the period

This period covers the first 12 months of the Sars-Cov 2 pandemic and the restrictions that were placed.

Given the nature of the pandemic and the clinically extremely vulnerable patients we care for, all face to face meetings and fundraising events were cancelled. Support meetings were moved to a virtual platform, namely Zoom, and a subscription was paid to allow us to have as many participants as needed for as long as needed. We asked all the current and new patients if they possessed the hardware and software necessary and where there were gaps, we purchased equipment, mainly tablets and cameras to assist and ensured safe delivery. We also purchased mobile phones and tablets to ensure patients who were admitted could communicate with families. The feedback from these small gestures was very positive.

Zoom meetings were held weekly initially and then smaller groups were set up as different needs were assessed and met. This involved a lot of time and input from the trustees and the specialist nurse but was very much needed.

The major fundraising events were cancelled (namely Armed Forces Day, Action Mesothelioma Day, Patient and Carer Day, The Christmas Lunch and Johnny Cowling memorial event) and a close eye was kept on charitable expenditure. However it did become apparent that we were in a stable financial position and a donation of £10,000 was planned for Mesothelioma UK.

There was no expenditure on education as all events moved to a virtual platform and were free.

We remain hopeful that the pandemic will not place restrictions on life as we move forward in to 2021 and hope to re-instate all face to face meetings and to continue to offer support in whatever ways we can.

#### **Financial Review**

The trustees are pleased with the level of donations in this starting period of the charity which total £28,252 which are all unrestricted. Expenditure was £10,744 and therefore at the end of the financial year there was £41,532 in the charity bank account which represents unrestricted funds. During the period we purchased Covid 19 PPE for beneficiaries, promotional merchandise, a mobile phone and educational medical books on breathing along with the normal operational costs.

As we are a newly formed charity the trustees will hold sufficient cash reserves to meet future plans and to protect against unforeseen future expenditure.
