In particular, the trustees consider how planned activities will contribute to the aims and objectives that have been set.			

#### **Achievements and Performance**

Summary of the main achievements of the charity, identifying the difference the charity's work has made to the circumstances of its beneficiaries and any wider benefits to society as a whole.

During the year ended 31 December 2020, the Association generated income of £14,718, which was comprised of members' subscription fees, bank interest received & also a reimbursement for a proportion of the prior year's 'joint societies workshop'. Expenses included: payment of travel expenses & refreshments to meetings for BCCA Council Members; administration fees for the period 1st January 2020 to 31st December 2020 payable to the British Cardiovascular Society (the organisation responsible for the day to day running of our administration) and Civica Election Services (formerly Electoral Reform Services) totalling £15,301. Cash funds totalled £89,614 to carry forward at 31 December 2020.

The 2020 Annual Meeting scheduled for 11-12 November 2020 at The ICC Birmingham was cancelled due to the uncertainty of the COVID-19 pandemic. The meeting has been rescheduled to 1-2 November 2021 at The ICC Birmingham.

Response to COVID-19 pandemic: BCCA has produced guidance for those of all ages with congenital heart disease which has been updated throughout the pandemic. We have worked closely with patient groups and the Clinic Reference Group (CRG) to ensure consistency with guidelines. We have also worked with the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation and the Department of Health as required to ensure they all have appropriate information including the release of the BCCA study of COVID-19 in CHD patients.

Work is currently ongoing to further analyse the BCCA workforce survey results presented at the BCCA Business Meeting in November 2020, and we hope to publish the detailed findings in a journal during 2021.

The initiation of BCCA supported studies including work on COVID-19 in CHD patients and the study of right aortic arch.

Continued support and challenge of NICOR and the way in which national data on CHD procedures is collected and reported.

Developed a BCCA equality and diversity statement. This is currently being finalised to be published in 2021.

Increased new members, in particular from associated specialties, including nursing, physiologists, anaesthetics and intensive care.

This year's recipient of the Madeleine Steel Travel Fellowship was Dr Stefano Bartoletti, ACHD Fellow, Bristol Heart Institute who applied for support to undertake an ACHD and EP fellowship at the Montreal Heart Institute in Canada.

The sponsorship scheme for overseas cardiologists and cardiac surgeons was deferred due to the uncertainty of the pandemic. Due to the pandemic, the previous year's recipient, Dr Usha MK, Associate Professor in Paediatric Cardiology, Sri Jayadeva Institute of Cardiovascular Sciences and Research was unable to visit the UK to undertake her sponsored observership during 2020. Funding of the scheme has been guaranteed for at least another 5 years.

#### **Financial Review**

Review of the charity's financial position at the end of the period	As at 31 December 2020, the charity's reserves stood at £89,614. The reserves are all held in cash balances. The trustees believe that this is a sufficient reserve as it provides the funds to fulfil the objectives of the charity. In particular, monetary support is offered for applications for setting up Registries, research projects and the provision of patient information through web hosting and printed materials. Discussions have also been held regarding the possibility of the Association running its own courses/study days which would require significant investment.
