INDEPENDENT EXAMINERS REPORT

I report to the trustees of PhysioNet Fountain CIO on the accounts for the year ended 31.12.21 which are set out on page 1.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of the independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters.

The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair view' and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.

Independent examiner's statement

I have completed my examination. I have identified that a matter of concern because the charity does not put a value on all the donated equipment received and therefore not a value on all the equipment donated by the charity. The trustees believe it to be impractical to value each donated item however they have put a value on some items for which they have claimed gift aid on.


