WORCESTERSHIRE PARENT AND CARERS' COMMUNITY TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2021

Worcestershire Parent and Carers' Community is registered with the Charity Commission and governed by a constitution dated 30 January 2007. It is an association of approximately 200 member families and wide social media reach. The Charity's registered number, trustees and principal address are detailed on page 1. New trustees are selected and appointed by the trustees from within and outside the membership.

The trustees confirm that in undertaking their work they have complied with the duty within section 4 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit.

Objects of the Charity

The objects of the charity set out in the constitution are the provision of relief to people with a disability; in particular by providing help and support to them, their families and dependents and by assisting with the planning and development of services locally in Worcestershire.

The charity focuses on providing whole family support in the community for families who have a child or young person with a disability or additional need. We provide opportunities for social contact, specialist family inclusive activities, practical and emotional support and signposting to relevant support organisations. We aim to bring families out of isolation and give them a voice in the development of services in Worcestershire.

Summary of the main activities and achievements

We are proud to have continued supporting member families during this difficult year of lockdown and social isolation by switching to online activities where face to face has not been possible. We increased the frequency and scope of our member newsletters and have continued to provide access to our family workers by telephone or online. We have continued to represent families with a disabled child in the development of services in the region.

A proud achievement this year is the publication of a compendium of members' life experiences in the form of a book 'Love, Laughter and Tears'. This has been a collaborative effort and in addition to being distributed to all members has proved popular with outside organisations as a learning resource.

Our activities have included the following:

- online coffee mornings and yoga sessions for wellbeing. Parents and carers can relax and share information and experiences
- a supported family inclusive trip to a Safari Park, which allowed whole families to enjoy a break in the company of other member families.
- a monthly youth group activity for our members aged 13 years and over. Although some sessions
 were held online, the group enjoyed several face to face youth group events. The activities are
 designed to help our youngsters develop the independence and social skills necessary to grow into
 confident adults with fulfilling lives
- providing families in distress with access to a family worker for practical support and signposting advice
- compiling, publishing and releasing our book 'Love, Laughter and Tears' -a collection of life experiences from parents, carers and our young people.
- assisting in the implementation and monitoring of Worcestershire's Carers' Strategy through the Health and Wellbeing Board.
- taking part in the county wide voluntary sector covid response led and coordinated by Worcester Community Foundation
- continuing to engage with the University of Worcester, in particular by delivering an annual lecture on the Special Educational Needs, Disabilities and Inclusion BA degree course
- providing a patient/carer perspective to the Continuing Health Care Communications Working Group set up by Herefordshire and Worcestershire Clinical Commissioning Group

- providing a voice in the regional development of infrastructure for young people in the voluntary sector. A nominated individual serves as trustee of Young Solutions Worcestershire for this purpose.
- Working closely with other charities, organisations and our local authority in the development of services for people with a disability, particularly families including disabled children.
- maintaining policies and procedures commensurate with high standards of safeguarding and protection.

Financial sustainability remains a principal challenge. We are dependent on grants and donations for our continued operation and we are truly grateful to the organisations and individuals who have supported us this year, enabling us to continue our work including those who have devoted time and effort to fundraising internally.

Reserves Policy

The trustees' policy is to hold reserves representing at least six months operating expenditure to ensure that we can continue to deliver services and meet our financial obligations despite fluctuations in income. Our free reserves at 31 March 2021 are £40,656 (2020 £50,778) which is in line with this policy.
