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Report of the trustees for the year ended 31 December 2020

The trustees present their annual report and financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2020. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (second edition of the Charities SORP (FRS102) October 2019 effective 1 January 2019), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) and the Charities Act 2011.

The financial statements have been prepared to give a "true and fair" view and have departed for the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 only to the extent required to provide a "true and fair" view. This departure has involved following Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (second edition of the Charities SORP (FRS!)") October 2019 effective 1 January 2019) rather than the Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice effective from 1 April 2005 which has since been withdrawn.

The level of PCC income in 2020 exceeded £250,000 so the PCC could no longer prepare its accounts on a receipts and payments basis. The accounts for 2020 have been prepared on an accruals basis by transition to FRS102. The transition date is the first day of the comparative financial year so the figures for 2019 have been restated under the new basis.

Objectives and Public Benefit

The PCC's objectives are laid out in a variety of statutory provisions as applicable to all Parochial Church Councils, as clarified from time to time in case law. Most fundamentally, the PCC has the responsibility for co-operating with the priest-in-charge or incumbent (as applicable) in promoting within the ecclesiastical parish of St Lawrence with St Nicholas the whole mission of the church, including pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical matters.

As a charity, the PCC must demonstrate public benefit, with reference to the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit, and, in particular, such supplementary guidance as exists on charities for the advancement of religion. Accordingly, a summary of our activities is given below.

Activities and performance

We do our best to maintain and promote an active Christian presence in the parish of St Lawrence with St Nicholas, open to people from across York, and beyond. We seek to enable people to grow in and to live out their faith as part of our parish community; and we seek to reflect the joy and neighbourliness of the Kingdom of God through our activities together. We seek to advance the Christian religion through public access to the Sacraments, worship, prayer, and teaching; through provision of pastoral care for people living in the parish; through the maintenance of a house of worship and prayer; and through social activities which bring people together. To give a few specific examples:

- We ensure that public services are held every Sunday, both morning and evening; and we seek to promote these through advertising and the ringing of bells, and to be a welcoming and open church to those who come to pray with us.
- We try to provide pastoral care, and means to seek the aid of God and Church when in need, by promoting access to personal pastoral care from clergy and lay readers, by keeping the church and churchyard open for prayer and reflection as much as possible, and by ensuring activities and services are well advertised and accessible to all.
- We organise, promote, and encourage social activities and fellowship amongst both parishioners and visitors, through the choir, bellringing, and other church activities, and, via the operation of the Church Community Hall, through activities such as clubs for the elderly, coffee mornings, and our Harvest Supper; and we provide a friendly and well-kept venue for diverse activities.

In order to facilitate our work, it is very important that we maintain the fabric of the church of St Lawrence, and ensure that the Community Hall and the churchyard are well kept. It should be noted that the maintenance of our fabric is part of the public benefit that we provide, as a piece of religious testimony set in stone and glass, and through the public amenity provided by our grade 2 listed church (with its 15th Century font, good collection of 19th-20th century stained glass, and, now, its historic Denman pipe organ) and by our churchyard (a large part of which is a scheduled ancient monument and which contains a grade 1 listed remnant of the medieval church of St Lawrence) visually, as a venue, and as a heritage asset of the community and our nation.

But beyond fabric, we remember our much wider though less obviously tangible mission. We value our strong connection with our parish, and the wide range of people for whom St Lawrence forms an important part of their lives, even if they are not with us in church every Sunday. In this regard, we should perhaps particularly note our strong commitment to our links with local schools, and hope to see this link strengthened in future. We value our links with and support for St Lawrence's school, and we very much appreciate the contribution of University students to our church community, and aim to express Christian hospitality in our welcome to them.

The PCC is indebted to the many volunteers who give freely of their time and talents for the benefit of the church.

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Property

The PCC is entrusted by statute with responsibility for the maintenance and care of the church and churchyard of St Lawrence, the freehold to which is vested in the incumbent of the benefice (during the vacancy the sequestrators). The Church Community Hall is held by the York Diocesan Board of Finance as custodian trustee for the administrative trustees, which are the Incumbent and the churchwardens for the time being. The Hall is held on trust for the ordinary uses of a church community hall as part of the mission of St Lawrence PCC. It is managed financially in tandem with the PCC's funds and the PCC accordingly exercises a general oversight over the hall and its administration. The administrative trustees manage bookings and other day-to-day Hall matters with the assistance of the appointed Hall Manager.

Report on activities and achievements in 2020

The impact of the COVID-19 pandemic meant that the church and church hall was closed in March 2020 and remained closed until September. Some services were streamed to YouTube. The church was closed again in November, but opened for the Christmas services. Early in 2020, we advertised for a new parish priest and the Reverend Adam Romanis was licensed to the benefice in December 2020. A significant amount of work was completed to the fabric of the building. Despite the pandemic the successful completion of the restoration and transplant of the Denman organ from St Michael le Belfrey to St Lawrence was completed in November. The financing of this project, (£420,000) was made possible by the generous grants of a number of trusts and charities. We were also successful in securing a £25,000 COVID grant for emergency repairs to the north aisle guttering. 75% of this grant was paid out to us this year and the balance will be paid on completion early in 2021.

Financial Review

The balance sheet for total restricted and unrestricted funds shows a decrease of £51,985 from £112,378 at 31 December 2019 to £60,393 at 31 December 2020; of this decrease, £17,383 relates to general funds. We were fortunate that collections and planned giving held up well during the periods the church was closed with gifts made directly through the banking system or people giving 'catch-up' donations when returning to church services. The income from Hall bookings was severely hit by the Pandemic and the Hall being closed during the periods of government restrictions and lockdowns in 2020 resulting in a decrease in rental income of almost £11,000, about 50%.

Movement on the restricted funds are shown at Note 10.1-10.3 of the accounts, the most significant being the organ fund.

A freewill offering of £4,450 was made to the York Diocese Common Fund.

Reserves policy

Unrestricted funds are extremely limited and are likely to remain so for the foreseeable future. In view of that, the PCC has not established a reserves policy, but it aims to do so when the time is right.

Financial prospects and future plans

The members of the PCC regularly review its financial position and are mindful of their obligations to review and report on the charity's financial prospects. They have reviewed the impact of the pandemic, which has at times closed the church and hall and impacted on the worshipping community in other ways, and what the future may hold. Its members believe that the PCC has not been in a better position for a great many years. The very major and significant projects which were needed to address building maintenance issues across two large buildings have been completed, and the recent organ project opens us many new avenues for use of the building as well as mission. The last few years have seen a high number of vocations to the priesthood which in turn has led to the diocese to invest in a stipendiary minister at St Lawrence. It will be necessary to carry out a stewardship campaign once pandemic restrictions are removed, but the work described has put the PCC in a much better position than previously to carry out its aims and to sustain itself financially, so that its members do not believe that there need be doubt as to the PCC's ability to continue as a going concern. A very significant change in the public health position and a complete change in the direction of public policy in this area could lead to a more negative picture developing, but the members of the PCC believe that even in such circumstances the charity has realistic ways of adapting and continuing into the foreseeable future. The accounts have accordingly been prepared on a going concern basis and PCC members believe that the charity remains and shall remain a going concern.

Structure, government and management

All Parochial Church Councils (PCCs) are corporate bodies established by statute law as charitable bodies as part of the Church of England by law established. The PCC, like all other PCCs, operates under the Parochial Church Council Powers measures and associated parliamentary and synodical legislation. St Lawrence PCC has in previous years been excepted by order from registering with the Charity Commission, but the PCC applied for registration in 2019 and on 10th April 2019 the Charity Commission notified the PCC that it had been added to the Register of Charities as 'The Parochial Church Council of the Ecclesiastical Parish of St Lawrence with St Nicholas, York' with Charity Number 1182907.

The method of appointment of PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules, introduced by the Synodical Government Measure 1969 and since amended. The trustees of the charity are the members of the PCC. In summary, the members of the PCC are: the Incumbent (or priest-in-charge where applicable), the two churchwardens, and the Deanery Synod representatives are all ex officio members; together with a number of members elected at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) by those on the Electoral Roll maintained under the Church Representation Rules, the number varying in law depending upon the number on the Electoral Roll; plus co-opted members so far as permitted by law and appointed from time to time. All regular attendees of St Lawrence's services are encouraged to apply to be included on the Electoral Roll. All parishioners – that is, those residing within the geographical bounds of the ecclesiastical parish plus those on the electoral roll – are entitled to vote for the two churchwardens at the annual Vestry Meeting which conventionally immediately precedes the APCM. The PCC has by resolution adopted the Safeguarding Policy of the Diocese of York and in 2020 had a named Parish Safeguarding Representative. The PCC in 2020 complied with section 5 Safeguarding and Clergy Discipline Measure 2016 (duty to have regard to the House of Bishops' guidance relating to the safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults).

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For the year ended 31 December 2020

The charity's annual meeting was postponed from April 2020 and held over zoom, an online meeting platform, owing to the pandemic and restrictions on meetings, on 30th November 2020.

Independent Examiner's Statement

Note 1 - Accounting policies

Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transasction value unliess otherwise stated in the relevant note(s) to these accounts. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities; the current Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (second edition of the Charities SORP (FRS102, October 2019, effective 1 January 2019), and the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS102), and the Charities Act 2011.

The PCC constitutes a public benefit entitiy as defined by FRS102.

The financial statements cover all transactions, assets and liabilities for which the PCC is responsible in law. They do not include the accounts of church groups that owe their main affiliation to another body, nor those that are informal gatherings of church members.

There were no significant estimates or judgements made by the PCC in preparing these financial statements.

This is the first year that the accounts have been prepared using the accruals accounting method. This was necessitated by the significant increase in income due to the organ project breaching the income limit of £250,000 for receipt and payments accounting.

A summary of the changes is at Note 11

Going Concern

The Trustees have reviewed the financial position of the PCCy including the impact of the Coronavirus pandemic and have a reasonable expectation that the PCC has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, the financial statements continue to be prepared on the going concern basis.

Fund accounting

Restricted funds

These are revenue donations or grants for a specific PCC activity intended by the donor.

Unrestricted funds

These are income funds which are to be spent on the PCC's general purposes.

Changes to previous accounts

No changes have been made to accounts for previous years except as required to move to the accruals basis. A summary of the effect of the changes is at Note 11.
