About Us -

Collingwood School & Media Arts College is an all age SEN school situated on the outskirts of Morpeth, Northumberland. The school was built in 1954 and Collingwood opened in 1979 as a special school for children aged 4-16 with moderate learning difficulties (MLD). In 2008 we federated with King Edward VIth School in order to provide continuous education for our students up to age 19. From September 2013 the age boundaries in the school changed to accommodate pupils from aged 2 up to aged 19. The designation of the school also changed from MLD to ASD, BELD and S&L to reflect the changing range of pupil needs.

The Collingwood Foundation was formed on 24th October 2011 following a merger of accounts held by Collingwood School & Media Arts College (School Fund) and The Friends of Collingwood. Funding for additional resources or activities is not available within the schools delegated budget.

The Foundation exists not only to provide additional resources and opportunities for the students at Collingwood School & Media Arts College, but also to provide opportunities such as family learning and activities for students within the wider community.

About Us continued-

The Collingwood Foundation brings together staff, students, parents, members of the community and grant providers with the joint vision of enhancing the education and life experiences of the students. A revised constitution has been adopted by Trustees.

Members of the Schools Leadership Team (SLT) have been appointed as Trustees. The school Governors oversee the management of the accounts at the termly meetings of the Governors Finance Committee. All trustees give their time as part of their role within Collingwood School & Media Arts College and receive no additional remuneration or benefits for work they undertake for The Collingwood Foundation.

Report from the Chair, Gillian Linkleter -

The work of the foundation has greatly enhanced the provision and opportunities for our students and their families. This brochure provides a review of some of the events and developments which have been undertaken over the past year.

This year we have raised funds for several initiatives throughout the school.

- We raised £14,100 to support the development of Clark's Nature Reserve. We supported the reserve to dig a new pond and refurbish the visitors centre.
- We have raised £6,500 towards new equipment for the Media department.
- We raised £2,000 to support COVID expenditure .
- We spent £8,813 on new fencing for the Sensory Garden.
- We raised £1,087 from our Collingwood Shack and Enterprise initiatives in school.

The Foundation plays a vital role in supporting the Pupils and Students within the school. The funds are directly for the benefit of the young people to enhance their learning experiences and opportunities.

Clark's Nature Reserve

The funding we raised helped to build a new pond on the reserve and replace the roof on the visitors centre. Students and Pupils at Collingwood have been able to access the reserve all year for work placements and enrichment opportunities.


