Notes to the Receipts and Payments account for the year ended 30 September 2021

1 Turn Around prepares its accounts on a receipts and payments basis and in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Commission for charities of its size.

2 Two of the trustees incur much of the charity's expenditure on its behalf, and seek reimbursement from time to time. These reimbursements are reviewed and authorized by a trustee other than those incurring the expenditure. In view of the frequency and amount of such expenditure, the trustee loan account is treated as if it were a bank account, so that the charity's receipts and payments account reflects expenditure by the trustees in the year in which it was made, irrespective of when the trustees might be reimbursed. This provides a fairer view of the charity's accounts on a receipts and payments basis. The maximum amount owed to the trustees during the year was £1,170. The year-end balance of £955 was settled in October 2021.

3 In addition, these two trustees own the building partly occupied by the charity. The charity occupies its part of the building as a tenant but pays only a peppercorn rent; appropriate property costs are apportioned to the charity. The donations received include £2,935 from these two trustees.

4 Turn Around also received substantial support from the Garfield Weston Foundation, Chislehurst Rotary, the Waitrose Community Matters programme and a number of private donors. In addition Turn Around received Business Support Grants totalling £8,097.

5 In November 2020, Turn Around had to contribute £6,217 as its share of major and unexpected repairs to the roof of the building from the ground floor of which it operates.

6 Having considered its commitments and sources of funds, the Trustees are satisfied that the charity has sufficient resources for its present purposes.
