We organised a Halloween spooky walk at Watchtree Wheelers for all of our families. We had lots of members wearing the hi-visibility clothing that we purchased with funding from the Parry Family Foundation. Lots of people came in fancy dress and everyone had a really great time. The confidence of the children on the bikes was amazing to see. Everyone had a brilliant time and was good to get some fresh air and exercise.

We attended a Halloween event at Walby Farm Park that included pumpkin picking and carving, target shooting and a lovely show that the staff put together. The children were mesmerised during the show and had so much fun picking their own pumpkins. It was a great day all round.

Primark done a fancy dress event in store for all staff and raised a huge £175.78, very much appreciated.

The monthly bowling session was again thoroughly enjoyed by all ages with lots of people attending.

Primark hosted a quiz night with a raffle in a local pub. The pub allowed us to keep out charity buckets on the bar for a month and the total money raised was a fabulous £224. The night was a great success and lots of fun.
