In addition to the free reserves the charity has cash balances of £35,054 (2020: £92,393) and investments of £973,230 within the expendable endowment fund which can be released to support the activities of the charity.

The Trustees pursue a policy of maintaining a free reserve available to be spent in the furtherance of the charity's objectives, as well as covering future needs, opportunities, contingencies and risks.
