Because of Government COVID19 regulations, the BAY Centre closed at various times in the year in line with the various lockdowns and tier closures. During that time, the Charity received grants of £10,667 from the Government's Retail, Hospitality and Leisure scheme and £2,500 from the Burnham town council. Although it is not known how the pandemic will affect the Charity's future business, our Reserve fund of £23,652, will hopefully allow the charity to continue as a going concern.
