TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2021

Introduction

Structure, governance and management:

We are governed according to the 'Constitutional Practice and Discipline of the Methodist Church'. Within the Methodist Church we belong to the Bolton Circuit, which in turn is part of the Bolton & Rochdale District.

Our governing body is the church council which meets at least twice in the year. Trustees are generally appointed ex officio from those who hold an office within the church or circuit and from a cross section of church members. There are committees to oversee Finance, Property, Worship and Pastoral matters and other events organised by the Church Stewards.

Aims and objectives:

Our objectives are in line with those of the Methodist Church which are:-

Worship - The Church exists to increase awareness of God's presence and to celebrate God's love.

Learning & Caring – The Church exists to help people to grow and learn as Christians, through mutual support and care.

Service - The Church exists to be a good neighbour to people in need and to challenge injustice.

Evangelism – The Church exists to make more followers of Jesus Christ.

Review of the Year:

Following the outbreak of Covid 19 many of the usual activities had to cease or move online. The Church has successfully continued to provide a variety of online and radio worship throughout the pandemic.

The new Church building was handed over from the developers in April 2021 and a formal opening and celebration was held in July 2021.

Following the opening, communal worship services recommenced after appropriate risk assessments were completed.

Plans for 2021 - 2022

The church plans to provide a range of opportunities for worship, fellowship and study. This includes Sunday Services, Sunday School, house groups, a ladies and youth group as well as a wide range of community activities including lunch clubs and a successful parent and toddler group.

The Church sees the building as its opportunity to fulfil its mission and support the local community it serves. Part of the new building will be used as a café for the local community. There are a range of rooms that can be hired and we recognise a desire from the local community to become involved in activities after the pandemic. There has been interest from a large number of groups who would like to hire space to lead activity classes, support groups and general interest groups.

Financial Review:

During the year general income, including investment income, totalled £46129 (2019-20 £56260) and expenditure £61192 (2019-20 £56029)

The New Church Building Programme had income totalling £958589 (2019-20 £692765) and expenditure £926928 (2019-20 £800057). The building was handed over in June 2021 with minor works remaining to be completed.

The readily available reserves carried forward amount to £30000 for the general fund.

The trustees have every reason to believe that the Church is a going concern as there are sufficient members and supporters contributing regularly to meet commitments and liabilities.

The Church owns the properties in Harwood named the Community Hall, a graveyard on Tottington Road and also the freehold land and church currently in build. Other investments are held in cash deposits which are readily available reserves.

- active engagement in a wide range of ecumenical activities as part of the "Harwood Churches" group
- a Radio-based ministry that provides worship into the homes of the people of Bolton via Bolton FM

Underpinning everything that the church does, is a strong pastoral care team who both engage with our own members on a regular basis, but who also seek to offer support and care to members of the wider community as required.

Public Benefit

We confirm the trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

Structure, Governance and Management

The governing document for the Church is the Deed of Union (1932) and the Methodist Church Act (1976)

Detailed governance arrangements are outlined within the Constitutional Practice and Discipline of the Methodist Church by order of the annual conference (CPD)

Day to day management of the church is undertaken by the Church Stewards along with the Minister.

The Trustees are either appointed at the Annual Church Meeting, or through a range of named roles from across the church family, as documented in the agreed Church Council Constitution.

Trustees' Responsibilities

For each financial year ending on 31 August the Trustees are required to prepare financial statements that give a true and fair view of the Church's financial activities during the year and of its financial position at the end of the year and to prepare an annual report for that year. In preparing these financial statements, the Trustees have:-

- Selected suitable accounting policies and applied them consistently using the accruals method
- Made judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent
- Followed the applicable SORP and accounting standard, SORP(FRS102) as updated
- Adopted the going concern basis

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Church and enables them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the law. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and ensuring their proper application under charity law, and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Trustees are also bound by SO 603 of CPD which states:

"603 The Church Council. The Church Council has authority and oversight over the whole area of the ministry of the church, including the management of its property. Aims and methods, the determination and pursuit of policy and the deployment of available resources are its proper responsibility. In many cases it will appoint committees which will have authority, in their own areas of responsibility, to initiate action, co-ordinate the work done in the church, advise the Church Council and report to it, being subject to its authority and oversight."

The major risks have been identified and recorded by the Trustees with professional advice taken as required.

Income and Expenditure is being monitored in the General Fund and the Building Fund and is compared against budget at every Church Council Meeting to detect trends as part of the risk management process to avoid unforeseen calls on reserves.

Safeguarding

Every person has a value and dignity which comes directly from the creation of male and female in God's own image and likeness. Christians see this potential as fulfilled by God's re-creation of us in Christ. Among other things this implies a duty to value all people as bearing the image of God and therefore to protect them from harm.

Methodist Connexional practice outlines commitment to the following principles:

- the care and nurture of, and respectful pastoral ministry with, all children, young people and adults.
- The safeguarding and protection of all children, young people and adults when they are vulnerable
- The establishing of safe, caring communities which provide a loving environment where there is informed vigilance as to the dangers of abuse.
- We will carefully select and train all those with any responsibility within the Church, in line with Safer Recruitment principles, including the use of criminal records disclosures and registration with the relevant vetting and barring schemes.
- We will respond without delay to every complaint made which suggests that an adult, child or young person may have been harmed, cooperating with the police and local authority in any investigation.
- We will seek to work with anyone who has suffered abuse, developing with them an appropriate ministry of informed pastoral care.
- We will seek to challenge any abuse of power, especially by anyone in a position of trust.
- We will seek to offer pastoral care and support, including supervision and referral to the proper authorities, to any member of our church community known to have offended against a child, young person or vulnerable adult.
- In all these principles we will follow legislation, guidance and recognised good practice.

Harwood Methodist Church commits itself to ensuring the implementation of Connexional Safeguarding Policy; government legislation, guidance and safe practice in the circuit and in the churches.

Harwood Methodist Church commits itself to the provision of support, advice and training for lay and ordained persons that will ensure people are clear and confident about their roles and

responsibilities in safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and adults who may be vulnerable.

Reserves Policy

The Reserves Policy for the Church is to hold a minimum sum equivalent to six months' average expenditure.

1. Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with SORP(FRS102) as updated, being the current version of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice.

2. Funds

The funds held constitute: General Funds held for any purpose of the church which are Unrestricted. Designated funds are specifically for the New Church Building Project. Details of each material fund are disclosed in Note 9.

3. Accounting Policies

Basis

These accounts have been based on historical cost except that investments are shown at their market value at the end of the year, on the accruals basis to show a true and fair view of the Church's finaclal position and activities.

Income

Income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the church becomes entitled to the resources, and the trustees are reasonably certain they will receive the resources; and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Expenditure

This is recognised when a liability is incurred, or a constructive obligation arises, that results in the payment beng unavoidable. Liabilities are recognised as soon as an outflow of economic benefit is considered likely than not under the legal constructive obligation committing the Church to pay out resources.

Grants

Grants made by the Church from Its own funds are recognised in full at the time of the agreement or when the Church accepts that there is a legal or operational obligation to make the payment. When the grant is recurrent over more than ine year the balance payable in future years is treated as a provision for future commitments in the Balance Sheet against the appropriate fund, the provision being released in future years as instalments are paid in accordance with the originally agreed terms.

VAT

Since the Church is not VAT registered, all input VAT is charged with the expenses to which it refers.

Tangible fixed assets for use by the Church

These are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year, and individually cost at least £1,000. The leasehold property (Community Hall) is shown at estimated market value and the new freehold property (Church) is shown at valuation at 31.3.22.

Investments

Investments are valued in the balance sheet at market value at the year end. Investment income is included in the accounts when receivable and any gains or losses on revaluation at the year end are shown in the SOFA.

Debtors and Prepayments

Debtors include offerings not banked by the year end.

Creditors

Creditors include outstandings related to repairs and maintenance carried out in August and New Building Costs incurred in August.
