# Review of the year

Through its ministers, lay employees and church members, the Circuit has provided leadership, pastoral care, Christian teaching and worship and administrative support for its constituent churches, projects, and the communities with which they are connected.

The year under review was a continuation of our journey; through the global crisis that is the Coronavirus Pandemic. We have managed to maintain our connections with our various church congregations and reorganised to encourage and nurture the life of the disurch underwastly different circumstances. As the pandemic shifted and we were enabled to resume gathering again the various churches in the Circuit have been able to begin rebuilding and the journey continues.

As if the pandemic was not enough of a challenge we have also had to contend with a ministerial resignation, the loss of a worshipping community and the significant reduction of the membership of the other church they had pastoral charge of. Nevertheless; after some initial reorganization, the process of rebuilding was begun; and a new post was created with the keenly anticipated arrival of a Disacon appointed to the Circuit with effect from the 1st September 2021.

The Circuit supports a variety of projects and services for which laggemployees have been necessary.

The Circuit Leadership Team have been tasked with ensuring that each project continues to support the mission aims of the Circuit and wider Methodist Church and that the financing can be met within current projected resources. The Team have devised a format for doing this which has been accepted by the Circuit Meeting.

Training and advice is regularly given on Safeguerding. There-have: also been first Aid training days: offered: Opportunities offered by the District and Connexional Discipleship & Ministries Learning: Network are advertised and taken up where appropriate, in addition to training received from other organisations.

The CLT meet regularly to ensure the effective management of the Circuit, as well as praying together as we seek God's guidance for the future.

# lificome triends

Circuit Income is primarily drawn from the Assessment paid by the Circuit churches...

Other income mostly relates to contributions from the Circuit churches and external sources to support the employment costs of the lay employees for the various mission projects around the Circuit.

The global pandemic that resulted in the temporary closure of the churches for worship and use by other groups and hirers meant that church incomes were squeezed in the second half of the financial year and this lowering of incomes had to be recognised when setting the 2020 – 2021 budget.

# Expenditure Trends

Stipend expenditure has increased each financially ear in line with Conference approved increases. Other employment costs have increased following reviews of their salaries when compared to the living Wage from time to time:

Just under 15% of the expenditure is the Circuit Contribution to the District and Connexion, of which a significant part is used to fund the work of the wider Methodist Church.

Other expenditure includes maintenance and repair of the Circuit Mahses which has again been higher that year due to extensive works on one Manse with replacement windows throughout the property.

### **Fund Balances**

As at 31stilAugusti2021 the net current assets of the CircuitiUniestricted Funds were £82,191 giving: approximately 2.5 months cover for Expenditure from the Univestricted Funds.

### Plansifor 2021 / 2022

At the start of the new-Connexional year the churches in the Grout will still be slowly emerging from the effects of the dosures enforced by the Covid 19 pandemic. The Assessment for this year has been set at a much lower level to avoid stressing the financial situations at some of the churches in the Grout.

Title: Assessment calculations: will revert to the normal method based on 25% membership and 75% income. We will be welcoming a Probationer Deacon into the Circuit Ministerial team at the beginning; of the year so Stipend costs will be increased.

With the closure of Dorking Methodist Church on 31st August 2021, the Christian Centre now falls under the Trusteeship of the Circuit Meeting. The amount the Dorking Christian Centre is expected to contribute to the Circuit is broadly in line with the amount we could have expected from the Dorking; Methodist Church had that continued.

The Circuit will be supporting four lay employees by making grants to the sponsoring churches. This will be the second year in a three year cycle of support for these. I had dition an Administrative Support for the Superintendent will be employed with the cost being shared on a 50/50 basis with London Road Methodist Church in Hörsham.

Stipend costs for 2021 - 2022 will be: for one Superintendent; cone: Deagon, and one part: time: Supernumerary Minister.

The Reserves Policy for the Circuit is to hold a minimum sum equivalent to two months' average expenditure from the General Budget (less transfers from Circuit Model Trust Fund) plus the total of committed expenditure from the Circuit Model Trust Fund. Additionally, there are Designated Funds: sufficient to meet the full year's cost forministerial allowances and the training budget and unspent: monies from the annual budget of £15,000 for repair and maintenance of the manses. This should be sufficient to meet any, unforeseen item of major expenditure on manses and // or to be able to continue; in the short term, funding planned activities in the event of any inability to raise the full Circuit Assessment from churches.

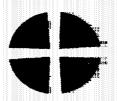

# \* Basis of accounting and accounting policies

### i Accounting standard

# ii Public:benefit entity:

The Dorking and Horsham Methodist Circuit meets the definition of a publisher effit entity under FRS-102! Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy note(s) below:

#### iii Basës

These accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical cost except that investments are shown at their market value at the end of the year. The accounts basis has theen used and trustees present accounts that show a true and fair view-of the Circuit's financial position and activities.

#### iv Content

The financial information presented is relevant, reliable, comparable and complete. Where estimates are used these are based on experience, research and judgement. The accounts are expensed in ESterling, rounded to the nearest pound.

#### v. BRS 102 SORP 2015

These accounts are compliant with FRS:102 and with the FRS 102/SORR/2015. The accounts have been prepared in accordance with applicable charity law in England this being the Charities Act 2011 and SI 2008/629 (Charities: Accounting and Reporting Regulations) and, pending the making of replacement Regulations specific to SORP 2015 in accordance with Reg.8(4)(td) of SI 2008/629, the charity trustees have departed from the requirement of Reg.8(5) by following SORP (FRS: 102) instead of SORP 2005 to the extent necessary to give a true and fain view in the circumstances.

### vi Going concern

Based on the monetary assets and human resources available at 31 August 2021, the trustees believe that the Circuit is a going concern.

#### vii Consolidation

The Circuit has denominational regulatory oversight in respect of the work of the Churches within the Circuit but has no legal or operational control of those Churches and their governing bodies except in extreme circumstances. For this reason, the financial statements of Churches within the Circuit are noticonsolidated into these financial statements.

# viiii Income recognition

Income is included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA): when the Circuit becomes entitled to the resources; the trustees are reasonably certain they will receive the resources; and the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Individual amounts categorised as Other income in the SOFA will be shown separately if they are considered material.

The Circuittacts as agent in the collection from Churches and payment overloof their contributions to various Funds controlled and administered by: The Methodist Church - "Connexional Funds". These transactions are not reflected in the SOFA because they are the income of the Connexion. Instead the transactions are disclosed in the Notes to the Accounts as required by SORP (FRS 102).

In accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102), the time of volunteers is not recognised. Further information on this matter is previded in the Thustees' Attenual Report. If goods are donated a value will be shown in the SORA or Notes where the value is considered material.

# ix Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised when a flability is incurred or a constructive obligation arises, that results in the payment being unavoidable. Liabilities are recognised as soon as an outflow of economic benefit is considered more likely, than not under the legal or constructive obligation committing the Circuit to pay-out resources...

#### x: Grants

Grants: made by the Circuit from its own funds are recognised in full at the times of agreement or when the Circuit accepts that there is a legal or operational abligation to make the payment. When the grant is recurrent over more than one year and from existing funds the balance payable in future years is treated as a provision for future commitments in the Balance Sheet against the appropriate fund, the provision being released in future years as instalments are paid in accordance with the originally agreed terms.

#### xi VAT

Since the Circuitis not/VAT registered, all input VAT is charged with the expenses to which it refers.

# xii Tangible fixed assets

These are capitalised if they cambe used for more than one year, and individually cost at least £1,000.

The freehold property is shown in the accounts at 2015 deemed values; which comprised the insurance rebuild costs at that time and an estimated land component value of £183,000 ii No depreciation is provided on the buildings because the trustees consider the current residual fair value of the manss buildings (on the assumption that they had reached the end of their useful economic life by the year-end) to be not less than their current value. Any, depreciation would not be material. The properties have been reviewed for impairment.

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# 3 Investment Property

During this year it became necessary to searce the required six months notice to the tenant then occupying the 41 Butters Road, Horsham manse as the house was required by a Deacon and her family from mid August 2021 and that journodification work was required to be carried out. Notice was served fatte December 2020 and the tenant vacated the property on 3rd April 2021.

Southwater Community Methodist Church closed but the remaining Assessment contributions for the year were covered by, fundament by, the Circuit. Dorking Methodist Church also closed on 31st August 2021 leaving 6 inhurches still active at the beginning of the 2021 - 2022: financial year.

This contribution from each church is determined annually by the Circuit using a formulation method that ich takes account of the relative numbers of members in each church and its relative income (after deduction of certain actual and notional expenses). Assessments on Churches are collected quarterly invadvance and are treated as pre-payments on a receivable basis.

#### Pensions

Ministers are members of the Methodist Ministers' Pension Scheme (MMPS) which is a defined benefit scheme. The Connexion accounts for this scheme is in deficit but a plan for the removal of the deficit has been proposed and is being implemented.

The Circuit's lay employees have the option of joining a pension scheme which the Circuit has arranged with. The Pensions Trust...This is a defined contributions action (although there are some legacy defined benefit scheme liabilities for 3 former members and 11 current members of the scheme). The Circuit contributes to this scheme as employer and, although there are some deficit flabilities in respect of former members; the planuthat is being implemented to remove that deficit imposes no contribution requirement on the Circuit. Accordingly, there is no value included in the accounts for that contingent liability:

# 9 Property maintenance and costs

The Circuit is Managing Trustee for 3 manses; 2 of which are occupied by ministers stationed in the Circuit. One manse (Butters:Road)-Horsham) was being let on a commercial basis but the tenant was given notice in December 2020 to enable refurbishment to take place and make way for a Deacon and her family to take up-residency in August 2021. The Circuit insures all the manses and whemit is housing a minister or deacon the: Circuit is responsible for the payment of Council Fax and Water charges:

The cost of ongoing maintenance, repairs and improvements to all the properties is funded through a Designated Manse Fund and a transfer of £111,000 was made from the General Fund. The level of transfer is reviewed by the trustees each year and this year an additional transfer of £60,100 was made to reflect the additional costs of refurbishment of the Butlets Road, Hörshammanse.

The Circuit pays for the quinquennial structural surveys on each manse and each churchlin the Circuit.
