# Achievements and performance

The club continues to grow with the provision of football and training for approximately 210 children plus Saturday morning football/coaching for our junior members.

Our separate goalkeeper coaching sessions specifically for our goalkeepers in conjunction with DC Goalkeeping has proved extremely successful.

2021-2022 footballing season was a very good year for us all and it was great to be back to playing and training.

Our footballing teams have been very competitive, and once again some teams have won trophies whilst others gained promotions. One or two also had the experience of playing finals at Fleetwood Towns Stadium -Highbury.

Our annual football club awards presentation is to be held on June 12<sup>th</sup> and promises to be a great fun family event for all.

We were successful in securing grant monies for the following projects From the Football Foundation – new football goals From Moon's trust – installation of a footpath to the toilet block at Pilling Memorial Park.

We have now replaced all of our plastic ageing goals with state-of-the-art quality aluminium folding goals.

For the first time in the club's history there will be a WJ u18's side next season and an all-girls football team WJ u10's Jets. We should have 23 teams in all next season across three different leagues and this is a tremendous achievement for the club and encouraging to see how this youth football club is continuing to grow.
