There is no waiting list and the trustees believe that the subscriptions set for each season are affordable for the majority of the local community. Subscriptions may be reduced or waived for those with less financial means.

 SWCC provides facilities to play and practise cricket across the entire range of cricketing ability.

 SWCC's facilities for playing cricket are only available to members, not least because it is a requirement of the various competitions in which SWCC takes part that players should be bona fide members of the club.

 Notwithstanding the above, the club's main ground is made available, free of charge, for a local Kwik Cricket league involving local primary schools, for the 'Chance to Shine' charity and also to the Saffron Walden Rounders Club.

 And finally, no charge is made for admission for spectators wishing to watch the matches taking place.

It is a large, ambitious club which is always mindful of its amateur status. It has over 80 volunteers who contribute at a variety of levels both on and off the field and the officers regard their support for them as key to the ongoing success of the club.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Achievements and performance

In keeping with the rest of the country the club faced its own challenges as we emerged from the worst of the COVID 19 pandemic and the related restrictions. The numbers of those participating fell somewhat. However, with the help of various grants available and the goodwill of our volunteers, we fielded 29 teams for men, women and children and ran a full coaching programme. For example, the Crocus squad for disabled players was very successfully revived during the 2021 season.

Our database contains over 850 players, former players, vice-presidents, sponsors and other supporters. With very few exceptions our sponsors and advertisers continued to support us and bring in additional income which helps us keep membership fees down and ensure that our volunteers, of which we have over 80, have the resources they need.

Our close working relationship with both the Essex and Cambridgeshire cricket boards continues to bring benefits to the club. We also continue to work well with local schools supplying coaches to over 20 primary schools via our Chance to Shine programme, organising assemblies to promote the club and hosting district tournaments.

Our Trustees and Executive Committee have continued to meet on a regular basis albeit virtually and our finances remain stable.
