### Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31st December 2021

This report includes information required by the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 and the Statement of Recommended Practice for Accounting by Charities 2005.

### **ADMINISTRATIVE INFORMATION**

Homewood Road United Reformed Church Charity is a local church of the United Reformed Church in Great Britain, and is a member Church of the Thames North Synod of the URC. It was registered on 28th November 2013 as Charity Number 1154798.

The Church building and the Manse at 2b Jersey Lane, St Albans, AL4 9AB, are vested in Thames North Synod Trust as trustees and held for the benefit of Homewood Road URC in accordance with the trusts applicable to URC properties.

#### STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The activities of Homewood Road United Reformed Church are overseen by the Elders' Meeting of the Church in accordance with the provisions of The Structure of the United Reformed Church determined by the General Assembly of the United Reformed Church, and supplemented by the Rules of Homewood Road Church. The governing document of the registered charity is a statement adopted by the Church Meeting on 3rd November 2013.

The Elders' Meeting is responsible for the financial administration of the Church, and the care and maintenance of the Church premises and the Manse. The Church Meeting gives general guidance on the life and work of the Church.

The members of the Elders' Meeting are the St Albans Cluster Minister – Rev'd John Hardaker and the above 13 members of Homewood Road Church nominated and elected by the members of Homewood Road Church in Church Meeting. Elders serve for 3 years, retire by rotation and are eligible for re-election. There is no limit on the number of consecutive periods of service. The members of the Elders' Meeting are the trustees of the registered charity during their period as Serving Elders. Elders share with the Minister in the pastoral oversight and leadership of the local church, taking counsel together in Elders' Meetings, for the whole church. Each Elder has a group of members and friends particularly entrusted to their pastoral care.

The Elders' Meeting meets eleven times during the year. It is assisted in the administration of the Church and its property by the Business Committee. The Church Meeting meets three times during the year, with additional special meetings as required.

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

As a local congregation of the United Reformed Church, Homewood Road United Reformed Church seeks the advancement of the Christian faith for the benefit of the public in accordance with the Scheme of Union of the United Reformed Church.

The Trustees are aware of the Church's charitable purposes, and endeavour to make decisions that benefit all. The Elders' Meeting believes that the Church provides benefit to the public by:-

"providing regular public worship for all, promoting the Christian faith, teaching the faith to all ages, providing training, nurture and activities for children and young people, serving the community, giving pastoral care and support to members and others in need, particularly those in sickness, distress and poverty, providing premises and resources for community groups and activities, providing religious activities for the general public and indeed all mankind."

## **RECORD OF ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS 2021**

The Covid pandemic continued to represent a major challenge. The church was open for worship in line with prevailing Covid guidelines. At times during the year, the associated hall premises were also able to open; good liaison was maintained with regular hirers so that they could quickly resume their activities whenever possible. The elders continued to undertake a significant amount of pastoral care, particularly with those unable or unwilling to come to church while the risks remained high. Some services were conducted over Zoom from one of the three cluster churches by the Minister Rev John Hardaker, to allow wide participation across the cluster of churches. Taking account of the experience of Covid, Homewood Road went out to tender for a new audio visual system for the church with the potential to livestream services in the future, and a grant of £45,000 was awarded by Thames North Synod for the project. Contact was maintained with the church's young people and their families, although the Youth & Families Worker left during the year and has not yet been replaced.

#### **FINANCIAL REVIEW**

I am pleased to present the accounts for last year, which show an overall surplus of £53,825. The final estimated surplus was budgeted at £26,800, but did not take account of the grant of £45,000 received from Thames North Synod Trust or the initial deposit of £23,567 towards the new audio visual system.

Hall receipts are gradually increasing from the previous year end and, whilst still significantly below pre-covid levels, there is every reason to be optimistic for the future.

Overall, our expenditure is as expected and noticeably we have increased our contribution to Ministry and Mission to £49,800. This was greatly facilitated by a drawdown of funds from URC Thames North Trust, as indicated in Note 3.

Our Legacy and Memorial Fund now stands at £355,390, having paid out professional fees of £360 and has been credited with a further increase of £31,093 in the value of our COIF Investment.

Whilst economically the outlook for the current year gives cause for optimism, as far as the effect of COVID is concerned, the distressing events in Ukraine will inevitably impact negatively on global economies.

#### **NOTES**

#### 1. Ministry and Mission - £49,800

The payment to Central Office not only covers Ministers' stipends and pension contributions, etc., but also contributes substantially towards what is called "Wider" Ministry, i.e. contributions to Ministry in other parts of the country, to the Actuarial Pension Deficit and to the cost of ministerial members of Church House Staff, Colleges, Moderators and Specialised Ministries.

It also includes our contribution for the work of the U.R.C. both at home and overseas which is organised and paid for centrally.

# 2. Contributions to other Funds raised by Direct Appeals, Retiring Offerings, Donations, etc.

In addition to the above mentioned contributions to the Wider Ministry and to the U.R.C. work at home and overseas, a further total of £2,925 was raised for other 'outside' charitable causes. These are summarised as follows:-

#### 3. URC Thames North Trust - £20,000

This is a part drawdown from the funds held on our behalf, following the sale of our previous Manse. The net balance of these funds is now £109,083.

#### 4. Grant - £45,000

This is a grant from Thames North Synod Trust, towards the cost of our new audio visual system.

### 5. Insurance claim - £40,000

This is the first instalment of our hall lettings loss of income claim following the effect of COVID.
