STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANGEMENT

The Trust was registered as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (registration number 1190712) with the Charity Commission on 4 August 2020. The Trust is required to have a minimum of three trustees. Five trustees served throughout the reporting year to 31 March 2022. Future trustees are to be appointed by a properly convened meeting of the Charity Trustees. All trustees must subscribe and adhere to, in belief and lifestyle, the Statement of Faith. The trustees are required to meet at least four times in any calendar year.

Management of risk

The Trust's activity has been, and will continue to be, the award of grants to support the objects of The Trust. Grants are only awarded if The Trust has sufficient available reserves and therefore The Trustees consider there to be little risk to manage.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The Trust's objective is, for the public benefit, to advance the Christian faith in such ways as the Charity Trustees may from time to time decide.

The founding Trustees have set up The Trust in commitment to the evangelical tenets of the Christian faith and therefore the activities of The Trust will only be to support evangelical Christian ministry.

The Trust's activities during the year ended 31 March 2022 have been, as in the previous reporting period, to raise funds from private individuals and charitable trusts to enable grants to be awarded to churches, Christian groups and individual Christians. The Trustees consider grants to:

- advance the Christian religion by supporting ministry which builds Christians up in their faith and presents to others the truth about Jesus.
- advance Christian education and training enabling individuals to better participate in Christian ministry.

The Trustees are aware of the requirements for the Trust, as a registered Charitable Incorporated Organisation, to be acting in the public benefit, and the Trustees are of the view that the Trust's activities are in the public benefit as defined by the Charity Commission.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

During the year to 31 March 2022, the charity received voluntary donations from individuals and awarded one grant to Oughtibridge Parish Church to support the post of Youth, Children's, and Families Worker.

Related party transaction

Christopher Tufnell and Rachel Field (both trustees during the period) were members of Oughtibridge PCC during the period.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

During the year to 31 March 2022 the Trust received donations of £19,310 (prior period - £12,369), recovered gift aid of £1,372 (prior period - £Nil) and awarded a grant of £9,000 (prior period - £4,500). The increase in funds over the year was £11,586 and total funds at the end of the period was £19,421.

Reserves

The Trust does not have a reserves policy as grants are only awarded when adequate funds are available.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of The Langsett Trust (registered charity number 1190712)
