Hi all thank you for your interest and ongoing support throughout the year even during such a difficult time as covid we all here at Pentrebane zone really do hope that you are all coping with some of the hardest changes we have all had to make

November 2020

Due to a firebreak lockdown all our youth groups were completed online. Due to downtime, there was staff training completed. We also continued throughout the year giving food bags to those in need.

December 2020

We did food hampers for the community and delivered them due to restrictions there were no activities over the Christmas season.

January 2021

We had funding for mental health from National lottery community fund this was to provide a safe and friendly zone for anyone who was feeling isolated due to lockdowns, anxious, stressed, depressed or suffer with any form of illness relating to mental health. we gave those in need the ability to relax in a nonformal way to gain confidence, create higher esteem and to be able to open up and for us to listen without making judgements and concentrate on their needs in that moment. Having experts who can give advice on exercise, having a healthy diet and sustain wellbeing.

February 2021

Still being in lockdown we were restricted to online youth activities, staff training and our mental health meetings.

<u> March 2021 - April 2021</u>

March saw the start of our youth outreach programme giving out educational packs and generally just chatting to the youth. Helping people with food and essentials has continued throughout the whole lockdown and we still help people at present.

We held a social distance gardening and a clean-up of the polytunnel and surrounding areas thanks to a couple of volunteers who were really struggling with the lockdown and being isolated with no family or friends we had some lovely reviews from these people expressing how much the zone has helped them with their mental health during such hard and pressing times.

<u>May 2021</u>

Our fantastic volunteers as mentioned above attended the outside of the centre and with use of the poly tunnel following social distance guidelines, they planted seeds and grew some fabulous flowers, herbs, fruits and vegetables (These can be seen on our Facebook page @Pentrebanezone) We also had a fun day with lots of educational activities (building bird houses and arts and crafts), we also had a theatre attend putting on a play.

<u> June 2021 - July 2021</u>

We were able to open up our youth clubs inside again which had an amazing impact on the community. Coronavirus is affecting so many aspects of our society today and a new set of challenges for them, and data suggests we're facing serious challenges related to depression, anxiety, isolation and emotional exhaustion. A high proportion of people report higher levels of stress, feel sadness day-to-day and that their overall mental health has declined since the outbreak of COVID-19. Providing a safe and welcoming environment where we can have a positive impact and enable those who are suffering to connect. we must pay attention to mental health and help ourselves and each other be as mentally healthy as possible.

August 2021

We took the youth and families on a day trip to folly farm, this was well received. Mental health, youth club, food bags continued.

September - October 2021

Usual activities commenced. Halloween party was held for the community due to turnout 2 parties had to be held.

Addition info :

During the months we were closed due to covid we still made sure that our community members were aware that we were still available to be contacted for any help they may need and for food parcels for the vulnerable families of the community that they were able to access from outside the zone. The youth workers did everything they could to reach out to the children and families via social media and other forms of contact, the provided learning packs, wellbeing packs & ran online sessions such as games and quizzes.
