1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The PCC is a public benefit entity within the meaning of FRS102. The financial statements have been prepared under the Charities Act 2011 in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 governing the individual accounts of PCCs with the Regulations' "True and fair view" provisions and applicable accounting standards and the 2016 version of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP(FRS102)).

ASSETS

Consecrated and benefice property

In so far as consecrated and benefice property of any kind is excluded from the statutory definition of 'charity' by Section 10(2) (a) and (c) of the Charities Act 2011 such assets are not capitalised in the financial statements.

Moveable church furnishings

These are capitalised at cost and depreciated over their useful economic life other then where insufficient cost information is available. In this case the item is not capitalised, but all items are included in the Church's inventory.

Tangible fixed assets for use by the charity

These are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year, and cost at least £2,000 each. They are valued at cost or else, for gifts-in-kind, at a reasonable estimate of their open market on receipt.

Depreciation is calculated to write off the capitalised cost of fixed assets over their estimated useful lives depending on the type of asset as follows:

Office equipment

5 years

Land and buildings - the PCC adopts the policy regarding the clergy house (temporarily let) at 95 Evelyn Road,
Dunstable of accounting at 'current market value' based on valuations within the last 3 years.

Investments

Investments quoted on a recognised stock exchange or whose value derives from them are valued at market value at the year end.

Short term deposits

These are the cash held deposits either with the CCLA or at the bank.

FUNDS

Unrestricted Funds

These represent the remaining income funds of the PCC that are available for spending on the general purposes of the PCC, including amounts designated by the PCC for fixed assets for its own use or for spending on a future project and which are therefore not included in it's 'free reserves' as disclosed in the trustees report.

Restricted Funds

These are income funds that must be spent on restricted purposes and details of the funds held and restrictions provided are shown in the notes to the accounts.

Endowment Funds

These are restricted funds that must be retained as trust capital either permanently or subject to a discretionary power to spend capital as income, and where the use of any income or any other benefit derived from the capital may be restricted or unrestricted. Full details are shown in the notes to the accounts

Functional charitable land and buildings are not included in the balance sheet. This comprises the Priory Church Hall which has a valuation of approximately £200,000 (1997), The land was acquired by deed of grant from The Crown Estate in 1839 to be used as a school and later in 1923 the use was changed to that of church and similar meetings. Should this change, outside those permitted by the grants, there would be a right of re-entry to the Crown Estate. Therefore no commercial gain would be realised.

ANNUAL REPORT TO THE CHARITY COMMISSIONERS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2021

Aim and Purposes

The primary object of the Parochial Church Council (PCC) is the promotion of the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to the doctrines and practices of the Church of England. The statutory function of the PCC is to co-operate with its ministers in promoting in the parish the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical.

Throughout 2021, the parish and all the PCC's activities continued to be significantly affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, with national and local restrictions affecting all activities and social interaction, and particularly those affecting places of worship; the PCC's aim and purposes were conducted within this context.

Objectives and activities

The PCC is committed to enabling as many people as possible to join in worship and mission and to become part of our parish community. The PCC maintains an overview of worship and mission throughout the parish and makes suggestions on how activities can reach and involve people throughout the parish and beyond. Worship puts faith into practice through prayer and scripture, music and sacrament. This continued throughout 2021, even when it was not possible to gather in person for worship or other activities.

When planning activities in 2021, the PCC considered the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit and in particular the guidance on charities seeking the advancement of religion. In particular, the PCC tried to help ordinary people to live out their faith as part of our parish community, with activity that addressed this need through:

- Worship and prayer
- Pastoral care and support for people living in the Parish
- Mission and outreach work

To facilitate the activities, it was and is important to maintain the fabric of the church buildings and premises for which the PCC is responsible.

Achievements and Performance

The PCC worked hard to ensure the continuation of worship, mission and pastoral care within legal and practical constraints, in line with detailed guidance from the Church of England. The PCC implemented and oversaw processes for risk assessment and health and safety measures to ensure that all worship, mission and pastoral care might be conducted safely as well as legally.

Throughout 2021 there were legal and advisory restrictions on activities in church buildings, though these decreased over the course of the year. Worship in all three church buildings resumed on Easter Day and became more frequent thereafter; all three churches also continued to offer online

worship. Newsletters and social media enabled contact to continue and new contacts to be made, helping the PCC to fulfil its objectives in new ways and changing circumstances.

St Augustine's church continued to host Dunstable Foodbank. The Revd Tim Davis continued to provide chaplaincy services to two local secondary school academies.

Adults and young people involved in the churches' worship and activities are encouraged to join the Parish Electoral Roll and vote for churchwardens and officers of the PCC and DCCs. In 2021 the number on the Electoral Roll was 199, an overall decrease of 6 from 2020, distributed as follows:

St Augustine 51
St Fremund 29
Priory Church of St Peter 119

In June 2021 we welcomed The Revd Jenna Dearden to the clergy team, following her ordination as a deacon; she is licensed as Assistant Curate to the Dunstable Team until June 2024.

For much of 2021, numbers attending baptisms wedding and funerals were restricted by law; nonetheless, the ministers in the Team conducted occasional offices for those living in the parish, or connected with it:

In November, the Bishop of Bedford led a service of Baptism and Confirmation in the Priory Church: one adult as baptised and confirmed and another two adults and two teenagers from the Team were confirmed.

Structure, governance and management

The Parish of Dunstable is part of the Diocese of St Albans in the Church of England. It comprises the PCC and the three District Church Councils (DCCs) of the Priory Church of St Peter, St Augustine of Canterbury and St Fremund the Martyr.

The ordained and licensed staff in 2021 comprised Team Rector, the Revd Rachel Phillips, Team Vicars the Revd Ricky Turner and the Revd Tim Davis and, from 26 June 2021, the Revd Jenna Dearden, who was ordained deacon on 26 June 2021. Dr Johan Schoeman, formerly licensed Reader, left the team in January 2021 on moving to another part of the country.

The method of appointment of PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules. PCC members include the clergy and churchwardens; representatives to the deanery and diocesan synods; and members elected by those members of the congregation who are on the electoral roll of the parish. All those who attend our services are encouraged to register on the Electoral Roll and stand for election to the PCC.

The PCC members are responsible for making decisions on all matters of general concern and importance to the parish including deciding on how the funds of the PCC are to be spent. The full PCC held four ordinary meetings during the year. There were a further four meetings of the PCC's Standing/Finance Committee. The Annual Parish Church Meeting was held on 16 May 2021 in the

Priory Church, with some people attending virtually via Zoom, to approve the accounts and various reports for 2020, together with elections of PCC members.

Safeguarding

Throughout the year, the PCC complied with the duty under section 5 of the Safeguarding and Clergy Discipline Measure 2016 (duty to have regard to House of Bishops' guidance on safeguarding children and vulnerable adults).

Financial review

The PCC Treasurer co-ordinated the volunteer treasurers of the three DCC's and to ensure that financial records were maintained for the preparation of annual accounts for the individual churches and the consolidated accounts for the Parish.

The net assets of the Parish decreased by £68,237 to £718,550 (2020: £786,787) with just over £32,000 relating to exceptional refurbishment items referred to below.

Total income of all funds for the year was £214,714 which decreased by £36,580 from £251,294 in 2020. The pandemic situation kept income at similar levels to that experienced in 2020. Two areas accounted for the income reduction as follows:

- Legacies were £10,598 for the year which was £13,841 lower than 2020
- Grants received were £20,658, down from 2020 by £22,290 as this included £27,132 relating to St Peter roof repairs

These together totalled £36,131 less than 2020.

Total expenditure of all funds for the year was £284,333 a decrease of £13,667 from 2020. The key reductions were £30,624 relating to reduced church maintenance costs and £11,395 less staff costs following prior year redundancies. The key additional costs in the year were £19,983 relating to refurbishment of Chews House prior the termination of our lease and change of location of our parish office in June 2021 and £12,158 additional costs incurred in carrying out repairs to our investment property prior to it being made available to our new curate and family.

Of the total, income for unrestricted funds was £195,951 of which £148,753 came from voluntary income including planned giving of gift aid donations, income tax recoverable, other planned giving, sundry donations, chaplaincy contributions and legacies. Church activities included £20,170 for hall lettings and £9,728 fees received for weddings and funerals. Fund raising brought in £2,472 and rental income from the freehold property £8,818.

Expenditure on unrestricted funds was £274,551 of which the major cost was £155,407 being the Parish's quota contribution to the Diocese of St Albans. Other expenditure incurred was £22,249 for Staff Costs, £35,461 for church running, maintenance and upkeep of services, £33,475 for church halls and Chews House running/maintenance costs, and £11,000 maintenance of the investment property.

Restricted funds income of £17,616 were £9,870 of grants and £5,735 of restricted use donations.

Net movement on funds, after fund transfers and investment gains, for the Parish is summarised as follows:

Unrestricted Funds net expenditure £ 53,884

Restricted Funds net expenditure £ 16,021

Endowment Funds net income/gains £ 1,668

Total Net Expenditure £ 68,237

Reserves carried forward at 31 December 2021 for unrestricted funds for general purposes were £476,204 of which £78,718 had been allocated for sub-groups and designated funds, leaving a net balance of £397,487. Fixed assets account for £325,580 of this, leaving current assets of £71,907. It should be noted that fixed assets include a current selling valuation of £320,000 for the clergy house at 95 Evelyn Road, Dunstable which was rented out during the first half of 2021 prior to becoming the new curate's residence.
