Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 December 2021

It gives me immense pleasure to present the trustees report for the year ended 31st December 2021.

As you know, the pandemic continued to impact life into 2021, however, I'm pleased to say, the staff continued to deliver a remote service to the most vulnerable and, around the middle of 2021, the staff increased their detached youth work due to the demand for mental health support and additional vulnerabilities, whilst still following National Youth Agency advice.

My thanks go to all the team at the Porch Project, Mike Grimwood for his supportive leadership and Kayleigh, Zach, and Lauren for all their hard work. They have all continued to do brilliant work even with such severely restricted circumstances.

The initiative to give free access to hygiene and sexual health products to our young people continued during 2021 and continues to be very well supported, thank you.

In 2020 we were invited to bid for a legacy grant being made available from the charitable arm of Hopkins Homes, led by James Hopkins. The brief was to bid for something different but of genuine need and after conversations with the team and the Trustees we bid for a purpose fitted mobile youth centre that would allow us to reach any young person within our boundaries, irrespective of location. During 2021 a great deal of work went into the design to result in a vehicle that could accommodate around eight people when static. The van provides a safe space for 1-2-1 discussions and coaching, it contains exactly the same information as our Youth Centre in Hadleigh and increases our detached outreach work by 100%. The mobile unit was delivered early in January 2022: it looks amazing inside and out and has already proven an enormous success in reaching out to more young people. Therefore, our heartfelt thanks to James Hopkins.

As always, a huge amount of thanks goes to everyone who has supported the Porch Project in any way, especially the extremely generous financial donations given. Due to your generosity The Porch Project has been able to give tremendous support and help to young people in Hadleigh, Great Cornard and the surrounding areas.

10. RESERVES POLICY

Introduction

The reserves documented and held should provide the Porch Project with adequate financial stability and the means for it to meet it charitable objectives in the foreseeable future.

Policy/Procedure

The Trustees preference will be to maintain the Porch Project reserves at a level of nine to twelve months operational expenditure, but as a minimum, six months.

Monitoring and revision

The Board of trustees will review the amount of reserves that are required to ensure that they are adequate to fulfill the continuing obligations a minimum of twice per annum and in addition within the Annual General Meeting financial report.

2021 Costs

Annual costs currently stand at £120,000 per annum and updates are delegated to the Finance Committee and signed off by the Chair of Trustees.
