Annual Finance Report 2021 (APCM 2022)

The treasurer is responsible for the good stewardship of church finances in partnership with the Finance Group and the Parochial Church Council. Together we acknowledge with gratitude the gifts entrusted to our stewardship and seek to use those gifts to further God's purpose in Wilford, the local community, and the world. The following information demonstrates how St Wilfrid's Church serves the local community and public benefit.

At the end of each year the Finance Group meet and set budgets based on a forecast of income/expenditure levels. The figures agreed are based on current income and expenditure with consideration for trends over the previous three to five years. We also consider known and potential changes in the year ahead.

The accounts presented here have not yet been independently examined.

At the end of 2020 the finance group, with support of the PCC, set a balanced budget for 2021. After nearly a full year of restrictions due to the Covid pandemic there was a high degree of uncertainty, and therefore the budget was conservative. The main commitment was to ensure we met the full parish share allocation.

The amount of Parish Share allocated by the Deanery was initially £58,216 but after a support fund credit was applied the amount reduced to £55,974. We paid £56156 so £182 more than allocated.

Congregational giving continued to fall, and the gift aid claim decreased because giving had fallen dramatically in the previous year. The result was nearly £10,000 less income than forecast but thankfully 'one off' gifts to the church were nearly £10,000 more than anticipated and the net income figure matched the budget.

Some expenses continued to rise during the Covid pandemic. Our ecclesiastical insurance now includes the church hall, and so has increased by about £1000, and campus maintenance happens whether people are there or not. Other 'people' related expenditure, such as gas and electric, were less than budgeted. The other expense worthy of mention is 'church and services', which was much more than budgeted. Although we did not meet in church, we did meet far more frequently online. We invested about £4200 in new equipment to ensure the quality and reach of services were the best we could afford. The cost is reflected in the 'church and services' figure. The net expenditure figure was less budgeted and therefore we increased our reserves by the end of the year.

We finished 2021 with reserves of approximately £18,300.

Clearly as we entered 2022 the uncertainty of inter-regnum and continued Covid restrictions made setting a budget as difficult as 2021. Therefore, it was a conservative set of figures again but through prayer, and God's grace, there will be a far more optimistic outcome.

Independent Examination of the Accounts St Wilfrid's Parish Church, Wilford

I have completed my examination of the accounts and am pleased to attach in the email the completed report for the Charity Commission. I have signed electronically and hope you find this acceptable.

I have some recommendations/comments arising from the review of the books of account. These are set out below and I am happy to discuss these further should you so wish.

- Examples were found of expenditure not without complete documentation in support. It is important to have the actual invoices for items purchased not simply the credit card slip or a list of items claimed.
- In addition, there were instances of cash payments to clergy, organists, etc that were paid directly into the person requesting the payment. Whilst I see no reason to doubt the bona fides of the claims made, it is inappropriate for an individual to be able to claim cash with no other authorisation. It is suggested that these be sent to the nominated authoriser and this person, not the recipient, authorise the payment.
- In relation to these above, I suggest that you, Peter, take the role of Financial Controller and review the paperwork on a regular basis and raise these kinds of issues regularly and in a timely manner as they occur.
- The donation to CAP, whilst part of an ongoing commitment, was not minuted. It is suggested that such gifts are minuted as evidence of approval.
