Achievements and performance

Our local Afternoon Cream this year attracted 36 local residents who had a lively afternoon with food and drinks and entertainment from a group of Yard Arm Folk musicians who also involved playing of various musical instruments by the guests.

Donating over £10640 to needy causes including large donations to Installation of public located Defibrillator device; Local Charity performing ECG Testing on Young Persons; Expenses to enable local scouts to attend 2023 Jamboree; Young Carers; SEND Charity; Young Minds Charity; Blood Cancer Charity; European Floods and Erecting and lighting Village Christmas Tree.

Also to help manage the Lions Club Zone Disabled Sports Day event involving over 300 disabled attendees participating in various and numerous sporting events.

Also, donating to international appeals from Tonga Volcano Appeal; Madagascar Cyclone Appeal and the Ukraine Appeal

We also donate to local HARP; Homeless Street Hub; Salvation Army; and two ladies on the Breast Cancer Walk.

In addition, we donated money to purchase a new washing machine to support a Local Homeless Persons drop-in centre in Southend on Sea and donated to Southend on Sea RNLI to purchase Thermal Imaging camera's.

We supplied Easter Fruit Baskets to four local Sheltered Homes

We also supplied Wild Tribe books to five local schools, this being the fourth year of donating updated editions to these schools.
