Key Activities during the year

GRNCA conducted a coffee club programme where people came together to share their experiences during their difficult time affected by Covid 19. It was the combination of various health awareness sessions too. Some qualified doctors and nurses came along to the programme to explain about their experiences and share their knowledge to the community. Sessions included on stress management and cancer awareness programme too.

GRNCA sent the Volunteers in vaccination hub centre for 22 weeks. GRNCA co-operated with RVA and sent the volunteers in both morning and evening shifts continued for 22 weeks. They helped the vulnerable people of different communities. People who needed support, guidance and interpretation service were among specially benefitting from the volunteers.

GRNCA helped some international Students with financial difficulties during the Covid Pandemic. So that they could reach their home back safely. GRNCA distributed some Oxygen concentrator plants to the needed hospital of NEPAL through NRNA UK. GRNCA organised a READING CUP FOOTBALL TOURNAMENT safely and successfully following all Covid rules and regulations.

GRNCA continued its' Language class for those who were interested to learn Nepali Language. These classes were online with a consideration of COVID PANDEMIC. GRNCA helped the local Volleyball team supporting the entry fee to various tournament across the country.

GRNCA conducted a virtual Bhanu Jayanti poetry event to attract youths to the community by literature.

Unfortunately, GRNCA couldn't carry out some of our regular activities due to Covid 19.

Financial review

The year has observed a considerable growth in revenue compared to previous period, partly contributed by the Gift aid donation as well. Local authority grant, public donation for covid help and football game have been major revenue generator and the charity has managed to support community with a huge donation as well during the year.
