Independent Examiners' report to the Trustees of Upper Wharfedale Agricultural Society

Objects

The Charity was inaugurated in 1897. It's principal objects are to promote agriculture, and other kindred arts and industries, including the breeding and rearing of livestock being best suited to the district, and to hold an annual show for the exhibition of live stock, horticultural produce etc. The Charity is run by voluntary management, finance and sports committees. The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finance of the trust and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate our exposure to those risks. In accordance with the trust deed, the trustees have the power to make any investment which they see fit.

Review of progress and achievements

Following the cancellation of the 2020 show due to the global Covid-19 pandemic, the 2021 show did go ahead as planned. Preparations included liasing with Environmental Health and other statutory bodies to ensure the event was as Covid safe as possible.

Entries in some classes, particularly Cattle, were reduced, which was attributed to the fact that many other shows locally were cancelled, which made show preparation of animals difficult. However, the classes were generally well supported and the high standard of the classes were noted.

As usual the varied selection of traditional demonstrations and exhibitions took place. An additional Show Arena was introduced to space the crowd out, and a new car park field used, both being well received. Produce, Handicrafts and Horticulture, Sticks and Dry Stone Walling were all well supported.

The Children's Educational Arena was again very successful and busy throughout the day. The Sports again saw a large number of entries. A new handicapped for age mile race was introduced and the Crag Race was the usual exciting finale to this part of the show.

For the first time on line ticket sales were introduced which was very well received and resulted in a huge number of pre show tickets being purchased. This made entry into the field quicker and easier and resulted in far less cash than usual being handled. A very large crowd attended and the enlarged showfield ensured that there was plenty of space for everyone. Sincere thanks are given to the Management Committee and Stewards for their dedication and hard work, not just on show day but throughout the year. Without them the show would not be the success it is or be able to continue for future generations to enjoy. Our sincere appreciation is also extended to our many local sponsors for their continued support and generosity.

1 Accounting policies Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The accounts are in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Charities SORP 2005 (Accounting and Reporting by Charities) and comply with the Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2011 issued under the Charities Act 2011.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Sheep hurdles	33.3% reducing balance
Fixtures & fittings	33.3% reducing balance
Barriers & fencing	33.3% reducing balance

Turnover

Income from commercial activities is included in the period in which the charity is entitled to receipt.

Income from donations and grants is included in incoming resources when these are receivable.

Interest is included when receivable by the charity.

Resources expended

Resources expended are included in the Statement of Financial Activities on an accruals basis, inclusive of any VAT which cannot be recovered. All expenditure is directly attributable to specific activities and is included in those cost categories.

Unrectricted general funds - these are funds which can be used in accordance with the charitable objects at the discretion of the trustees.

Designated funds - these are funds set aside by the trustees out of unrestricted general funds for specific purposes or projects.
