Continuing to furnish the hall and its grounds with the essential items that can make this possible.

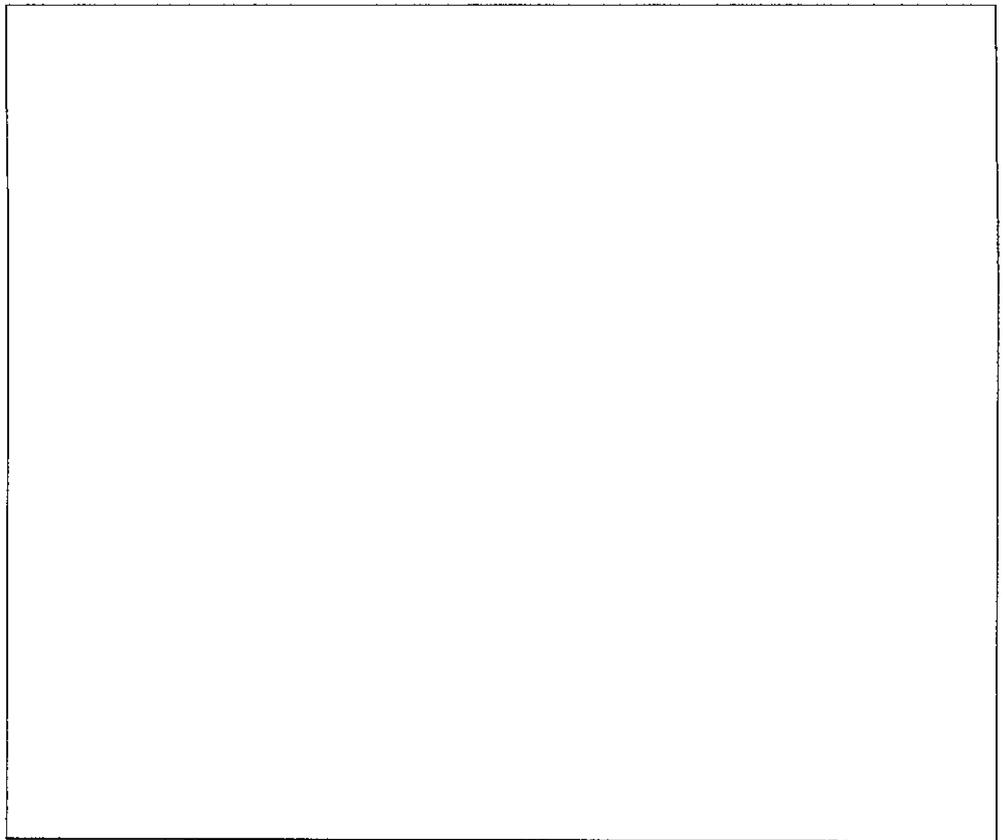

The charity has provided community benefits that include a safe venue for various clubs and associations where possible to carry on whilst adhering to government Covid 19 safeguarding guidelines for part of the year until all restrictions were lifted.

During the first lock down, we also operated a West Berks food bank scheme from the hall every Wednesday for families in need, both local and some a bit further afield.

This scheme was put into place with the help and support from Spotlight and run by an army of volunteers. This service came to an end in May as it was felt that since restrictions were now lifted it was no longer needed!

We were very lucky to receive a generous grant from West Berkshire council to enable us to finish the smaller hall, at last. Work on the hall was completed in May 21 and we celebrated with a family fun day and the naming of the halls.

We also held a very successful fund-raising event, a beer festival. It was hugely popular as was one of the first times every one could get together since Covid.

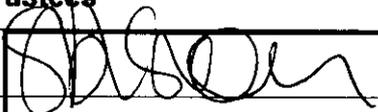
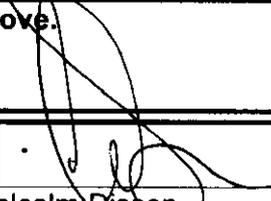
