The free sessions were designed to be accessible and fun for all who wished to attend while learning about new techniques. Attendees provided very positive feedback some of them stating it was the only time in the week that they went out and for some for personal reasons exacerbated by the covid pandemic it was the first time they had interacted with the local community in a very long time. There was evidence from post activity questionnaires that some people who had attended felt confident enough to engage in other activities in their neighbourhood.

The in person workshops provided voluntary and paid opportunities for artists to create and deliver workshops with support from In A Space. The Taking pArt project reached approximately 50 people including artists, volunteers and members of the public.

We have created a network of partners and artists that we can trust and work with again to provide opportunities for the public to have access to more arts and culture activities.

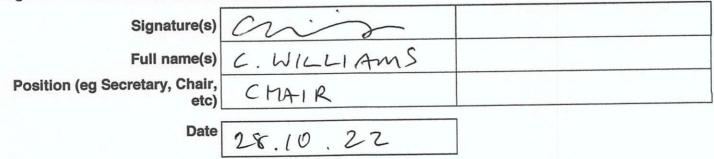
